ANNOUNCEMENT

A change is coming to *New Hampshire Bird Records*! As you have read in the last two issues, the struggle to fund *The Records* has become more critical. We have had many discussions on the best way to ensure their continued publication and improve their timeliness. The solution needs to provide a solid base of income to cover the direct costs of publishing and help ensure timely publication.

After discussions with staff and trustees, the choice has been made to change *New Hampshire Bird Records* from a member benefit to a subscription publication. Subscriptions will be available to both members and non-members, (members will get a significant reduction in the subscription price.) The subscription will normally be for a year with everyone renewing at the same time in October. This first subscription will run from February through September and will be offered at a reduced price, as both an incentive to give it a try and an attempt to soften the blow to longtime members who have been receiving this as a free benefit for so long. Renewal in October of 1994 will be for the full yearly price (\$10 for members, \$15 for non-members).

The Records is a valuable part of ASNH and provides data to many important projects. ASNH will continue to underwrite the indirect cost of maintaining this valuable resource and publication, such as staff salaries and computer equipment. The income from subscriptions will provide support for staff involvement and help improve the publication's timeliness.

We have been making a tremendous effort to get more caught up these last few months. A reliable source of funding will provide stability to these continuing efforts and I ask you all to join us and continue your support with a subscription. Look for the subscription form that will soon be arriving in the mail. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have questions.

Spring Season

March 1, 1992 through May 31, 1992

On the heels of a cold, dry winter, March started out unseasonably warm, perhaps giving the earliest migrants a false sense of security, since March 11 saw the weather change dramatically. Heavy rains on that date created ice jams and flooding in parts of northern New England, followed by two weeks of below-average temperatures. Snow was regular throughout the rest of the month, culminating in over a foot in some areas from a big storm on March 28. In general, birds did not appear to respond to March's fluctuating temperatures, but exceptions may include a very early Common Snipe in Lebanon, an Osprey in Pittsfield, and a pair of Rose-breasted Grosbeaks on March 18.

April started out uneventfully, but snow, sleet, and freezing rain covered New Hampshire April 11, and another week of very cold temperatures followed. During this cold spell, there were several reports of large flocks of early migrants, particularly Tree Swallows, Eastern Phoebes, and American Robins. Such large numbers suggest that birds may have been forced to concentrate near reliable food supplies. Warm weather on April 21 and 22 may have pushed raptors and grebes — as well as the earliest individuals of several passerine species — into the state a few days later.

May's temperatures were normal, but low rainfall made this the fifth-driest May on record. Most species that traditionally arrive during May were on time, and there were no major weather-related avian phenomena.

Spring 1992 was a good season for rarities, and picking a top sighting seems a pointless exercise. Top honors go (in taxonomic order) to Black Vulture, Sandhill Crane, American Oystercatcher, Loggerhead Shrike, and Yellow-throated Warbler. Runners-up include Cattle Egret, Tundra Swan, Northern Shoveler, Gadwall, Piping Plover, Cerulean Warbler, and good numbers of lingering winter finches. The group summaries discuss each of these sightings in greater detail.

Loons and Grebes

Most Common Loons reached the northern part of the state over a week later than usual, but a total of 37 in Errol on April 29 makes up for the late arrival with one of the largest concentrations in recent years. Pied-billed Grebes were also late (for the second consecutive year) but otherwise occurred in expected numbers and locations. Horned and Red-necked Grebes staged a major flight on April 26-27, accentuated by the unprecedented totals of 150 and 450, respectively, on Squam Lake. A single Red-necked Grebe on the coast on May 15 was fairly late for such a southerly location.

Cormorants through Ibis

Great Cormorants were not reported this season, unusual considering this species' increasing tendency to linger into the summer months. An American Bittern on March 27 was exactly a month ahead of the main spring arrival for its species. Great and Snowy Egrets were sparsely reported, but one of each showed up at inland locations in late April. Cattle Egrets in two widely separated locations were the first spring reports since 1988. Braving mid-April's miserable weather were two Glossy Ibis, which spent at least three days in Weare and represent an unusual inland record.

Waterfowl

The highlights of this Spring's waterfowl migration were good numbers of normally rare ducks: Gadwall, Northern Shoveler, Canvasback, and American Wigeon. Also notable were a single Tundra Swan on the Connecticut River, 2 Barrow's Goldeneyes, and an escaped Mandarin Duck in Pittsfield. Overall, the big waterfowl movement occurred between late March and mid-April, as indicated by peak numbers of geese, Wood Ducks, Northern Pintails, Green-winged Teal, and Ring-necked Ducks. Sea ducks were grossly under-reported, and 5 of the 6 Red-breasted Merganser reports came from inland locations! Surely we can do a better job of documenting waterfowl migration along the coast.

Diurnal Raptors

Data from New Hampshire hawk watches showed peak movements of Turkey Vultures, Osprey, Sharp-shinned Hawks, and Broad-winged Hawks between April 21 and 23, during or immediately following the warm spell. Space considerations prevent us from including many reports of some species, particularly Osprey (52 reports of 70+ birds), Bald Eagle (23 birds), and Northern Harrier (28 reports of 30+ birds); the records presented are intended as a representative cross-section of the season. Highlights included the state's second well-documented Black Vulture (the first being a specimen from Randolph in 1926) and a Golden Eagle over Deering on May 3. There were several Peregrine Falcon reports, and 2 Merlin in the North Country in mid-May welcome further speculation on this species' possible summer presence in the state.

Turkey through Alcids

The upper Merrimack Valley continues to be the stronghold for the state's introduced Northern Bobwhite population. One wonders if they are successfully reproducing or if they are maintained only by regular reintroductions. Rails continue to be under-reported, despite the extensive wetland survey efforts that are believed responsible for increased bittern sightings. A cooperative Sandhill Crane spent several days on a farm in Dunbarton, where it was seen by numerous observers.

Shorebird reports, again sparse, are highlighted by 2 American Oystercatchers that appeared briefly at Seabrook Harbor. This represents only the third record for the state since 1970, before which the species had gone unreported for over a century! Is it possible that we are seeing signs of an increasing population of oystercatchers in southern New England? Another rarity, also at Seabrook, was a Piping Plover. This may have been an individual wandering north from the breeding population on Plum Island, Massachusetts. Early shorebird reports included several Spotted Sandpipers in late April and a very early (by a month) Common Snipe in Lebanon.

Notable gulls included a breeding-plumaged Laughing Gull on the coast and 9 Bonaparte's Gulls at inland locations. A Razorbill seen by experienced observers in Hampton Harbor on May 16 was never submitted to *New Hampshire Bird Records*, and I close this section by encouraging all observers to report such sightings in the future.

Cuckoos through Woodpeckers

The only cuckoo reports were two black-billeds in late May, the usual arrival time for this species. Great Horned Owls were actively calling by mid-March and had young in nests by mid-May. After a good winter invasion of Snowy Owls, it was not unusual to have a couple of individuals linger into spring. A Common Nighthawk sighting in Windham on April 23 would have been exceptionally early, but unfortunately it was not accompanied by sufficient details to be verified. The next nighthawk report was from the more usual date of May 21. Whip-poor-wills continue to be reported in respectable numbers, including a high count of 10 in Merrimack County on May 17. Only 2 Red-bellied Woodpecker reports came in this spring, and both were from the species' stronghold in the Merrimack Valley. Three Black-backed Woodpeckers represent a good showing of this often-missed species.

Flycatchers through Wrens

Most flycatchers arrived on time in mid-May, with the exception, of course, of the Eastern Phoebe, which showed up in late March and early April as usual, probably to be caught off-guard by the cold, wet weather during that period. Tree Swallows were no doubt similarly affected, since they arrived at roughly the same time. As mentioned in the introduction, unusually high concentrations of both these species may have resulted from cold weather forcing the birds to congregate along watercourses, where insects were relatively more abundant. The 2,500 Tree Swallows in Exeter on April 25 probably came in on the heels of the "warm snap" four days earlier.

Three reports each for Gray Jay and Boreal Chickadee were slightly above average for spring; all were from the species' usual northern haunts. The only Fish Crows were, surprisingly, from inland locations; we still need further documentation of this species in its normal range near the coast. A total of 41 Red-breasted Nuthatches in Albany on March 15 were likely a holdover from the winter's invasion. The Carolina Wren colonization of New Hampshire continues, with this season's total of (at least) 7 being the highest in recent years.

Kinglets through Vireos

Blue-gray Gnatcatchers were very well-reported this season. Most sightings were in west-central New Hampshire, where the species seems to be rapidly expanding northwards. It presumably still occurs in southern New Hampshire, although a dearth of reports would suggest otherwise. Yellow-throated Vireos may be following the same pattern, with the Connecticut River Valley as the center of abundance. Eastern Bluebirds arrived in late winter, but the peak movement occurred in the first week of April; I wonder how they fared after the storm of April 11. Robins were seen in large flocks in mid-April, well after their arrival in early March. Once again, I wonder if the cold caused them to aggregate.

Northern Mockingbirds were literally north in Whitefield and Columbia, as they continue to expand their range in New England. Fair numbers of Bohemian Waxwings and numerous Northern Shrikes were holdovers from better-than-average winter invasions. A well-described Loggerhead Shrike, an increasingly rare species in the Northeast, spent only one day in Newmarket.

Warblers

Most warbler species arrived in New Hampshire by May 10, roughly on time. Reversing last year's pattern, Blue-winged Warblers outnumbered Golden-winged, with the latter reported only from Durham. The result of hybridization between the two, a Brewster's Warbler, was seen in Durham on May 23. Most species — particularly Palm, Yellow-rumped, Cape May, Magnolia, and Nashville Warblers — were reported in higher numbers than in any spring since at least 1987. Does this represent an actual increase, an increase in observer effort, or subtle changes in the timing of migration? The stars of the season's warbler show were two southern visitors, both of which stayed on territories into at least June. First was a Yellow-throated Warbler, New Hampshire's third spring record (out of a total of 9) that showed up in Walpole on May 11. Cerulean Warblers are a more regular rarity, but the bird at Pawtuckaway State Park was nonetheless the first since 1989.

Tanagers through Finches

A Northern Cardinal was located in Columbia, still relatively far north for the expanding range of this species. Four Rose-breasted Grosbeaks appeared in the state before May, most notably a pair in Hinsdale on March 18, a month and a half ahead of schedule. Vesper Sparrows may be declining in northern New England, and in light of this the scarcity of reports to *New Hampshire Bird Records* is somewhat disturbing. I know they're out there, so let's make an effort to better document their occurrence in New Hampshire. This spring was an exceptional season for Fox Sparrows, with over 40 individuals reported between March 10 and April 20 and two birds lingering until May 17 in Concord.

Blackbird migration was again on schedule, with Red-winged Blackbirds, Common Grackles, and Brown-headed Cowbirds already present in late February. A Rusty Blackbird in Canaan on May 17 was a bit far south for that date. This season's Orchard Oriole visited a feeder in Claremont, also on May 17.

Following a good winter for northern finches, it was not surprising to see several species present in large numbers in the spring. Most notable were Purple Finches, Common Redpolls, and Pine Siskins, with the latter two species peaking on April 16-17 (many records not published). Both Red and White-winged Crossbills were reported from the North Country.






