

For those of you who wonder whether a sighting is unusual, we highly recommend "A Checklist of the Birds of New Hampshire," by Kimball C. Elkins. More than a simple checklist, this expanded listing of the state's species notes their abundance and seasons of occurrence. Data on each species is displayed in a clear format, with bar graphs using lines of varying thickness to demonstrate frequency throughout the year. The status is shown by region if variations are substantial. The booklet also contains brief highlights of the birding regions in the state by Tudor Richards.

"A Checklist of the Birds of New Hampshire," is indispensable for any active birder in the state. It is available in the ASNH Nature Store in Concord, or you may order it by mail by sending \$3.00 to: NHBR Checklist, ASNH, 3 Silk Farm Road, Concord, NH 03301.

On another front, some of you may receive occasional correspondence from a volunteer at *NH Bird Records* clarifying details on one of your sightings. Dot Soule and Margot Johnson often handle this work behind the scenes, and their help is very much appreciated. # Fall Season

August 1 through November 30, 1992


The cold weather pattern from the summer of 1992 persisted into the fall. Much of the region averaged about 3 degrees colder than normal for the month of August, and cool weather continued through November. A weekly census by Peter Hunt of birds along the lower Mascoma Lake region showed an early departure for several species, and Peter feels that the cool weather may have been the reason. No major storms or storm-related vagrants figured in this season's records.

Each fall pulses with migrants passing through the state. Although there is some overlap, they generally peak during the following times: shorebirds: August to early September; warblers: mid-August to mid-September; hawks: early September to mid-October; sparrows: late September to late October; and waterfowl: mid-October to late November. This year, shorebirds and sparrows were well-reported, but there was a noteworthy lack of reports for warblers, coastal waterfowl, and pelagic species.

The Audubon Society of New Hampshire organized a bird-watching trip to Star Island on September 20. Although it is difficult to get to and therefore rarely birded, the island is one of the best locations to find unusual fall species. The first organized trip in several years, this successful venture included highlights such as an **Orange-crowned Warbler**, at least one very cooperative **Clay-colored Sparrow**, and a less-than-cooperative but equally exciting **Long-eared Owl**.

Several **Caspian Terns**, an unconfirmed **Little Egret**, a **Red Phalarope**, and at least two **Yellow-breasted Chats** were among other interesting sightings for the season. The highlight, however, goes to the **Chestnut-colored Longspur** found and photographed by Iain MacLeod near his home in Deering on November 29.

## Loons through Herons

Once again, encouraging numbers of Pied-billed Grebes were reported for the fall—at least 40 sightings were documented. Since this species is usually solitary in its migration, the total of 15 seen on Powwow Pond in Kingston on October 24 was unusual.

Great Cormorants are normally found along the New Hampshire coast during the winter months, but the population seems to be increasing. This season there were two coastal sightings in September as well as five unusual inland reports.

The two American Bitterns reported for the fall is a discouraging total, but Great Blue Herons numbers were more gratifying, with a rare sighting of 25 birds apparently migrating south along the coast on October 15. Great Egrets were spotted at several inland locations, including one seen in Walpole perhaps as late as November 24. The Great Egret reports from Canterbury were probably all of the same bird. There was also an inland sighting of a Snowy Egret and one unconfirmed report from Lake Francis in Pittsburg. Unfortunately, no details were submitted with the latter sighting and since the Great Egret would be the more common white egret, it is listed as an Egret species only. A Green Heron also seen in Pittsburg was a rare find, given that this is the northern border of its range.

Two observers in Rye on August 2 described an adult Little Egret in non-breeding plumage, and, if accepted by the state records committee, this would be only the second state record and one of only a few for the United States. Sightings of this European straggler have been steadily increasing, however—check any Snowy Egret carefully on the chance that it may be this species.

## Waterfowl

For the second fall in a row, we have a report of a flock of Tundra Swans in New Hampshire. This was a group of five birds seen and heard by an experienced observer as they flew down the Connecticut River in Hanover on October 16. Because of the very subtle differences between the rare Tundra Swan and the increasingly common Mute Swan, this report is still under review.

Only one report of Snow Geese came in this fall, but it was a flock of 200 seen over Monroe on October 25. Canada Geese reports peaked during the first two weeks of October, with the highest total (500) on October 2 from Salem.

A sub-adult male King Eider, first seen along the coast in Rye on November 28, was a rare find that just barely made it into the fall records. "Sea" ducks were well-reported from inland locations during the fall: we have reports of Oldsquaw and all three species of scoters from various locations, including 84 Black Scoters seen on three different inland lakes by the same observer on October 30. At the coast on October 15, a large total of 300 White-winged Scoters was noteworthy.

A group of 30 Hooded Mergansers on Great Bay on November 21 was a significantly large number, while five Red-breasted Mergansers in Hanover on November 26 were very unusual for this coastal species.

## **Hawks**

New Hampshire hawk-watch data indicates that both Ospreys and Bald Eagles continue to be seen in increasing numbers. The largest single report for Ospreys came from Rye on September 19, when 33 birds were seen migrating south along the coast.

Despite the fact that Northern Harriers were well-reported from many locations, hawk-watch data suggests that their numbers are decreasing. The only significant migratory flight was reported from Rye on October 17, when 15 individuals passed by Odiome Point.

Broad-winged Hawks are very concentrated in their southbound migration, typically observed in New Hampshire during the second and third week of September. This year the big flight day occurred on September 14, when 2602 were seen from a hawk-watch location in Bristol.

For the third fall in a row, two Peregrine Falcon hangouts were once again occupied. A Peregrine first seen at the James River plant in Berlin on August 15 remained until at least October 14. The New England Telephone microwave tower in Manchester was the roosting location for at least two Peregrines from September 2 until November 10 or later.

## Pheasant through Alcids

Three reports of Northern Bobwhites are interesting, but Bobwhites normally will not survive New Hampshire winters, and sightings are usually birds released by local game clubs.

Shorebirds were well reported from the coast, with highlights including a rare Buff-breasted Sandpiper seen in North Hampton, five Stilt Sandpipers in Hampton Falls, and several reports of Baird's Sandpipers, including one very late individual in Rye on October 17. A Ruddy Turnstone and two Sanderlings were unusually far from the coast in Littleton on August 4.

The Pease International Tradeport is the only spot in New Hampshire where Upland Sandpipers nest, and it is also an important staging area for migrating birds, which stop here to rest and feed before their flights to South America. This year's population peaked during the first three weeks of August, with the highest count reaching 62 birds on August 14.

A **Red Phalarope**, normally a rarely seen pelagic species, was found dead in Lyme on November 8. Although the bird was brought home in the mouth of a family cat, internal observations indicate it was emaciated and probably died of starvation.

Several **Caspian Terns** were seen this fall along the coast, including two early individuals roosting on the Seabrook Harbor mud flats on August 23.

# Doves through Creeper

We received three reports of four Ringed Turtle-Doves from different areas of the state. The origin of these individuals is a mystery, but it's certain that they were escaped or released captive birds.

The Long-eared Owl on Star Island, the first report from New Hampshire in several years, was found roosting in sumac. A Snowy Owl was found dead, perhaps of starvation, in Hollis on November 13, and three were seen along the seacoast on November 29.

The Common Nighthawk is very punctual and gregarious in its migration, with peak numbers moving south during the last week of August and first week of September. They typically migrate in the late afternoon and early evening. This season, an incredible total of 52 reports comprising 747 individuals were recorded. The best single-day total was 73 birds in Effingham on August 27.

Only four Yellow-bellied Sapsuckers were reported this fall. Four Red-bellied Woodpeckers were not surprising given the northward expansion that this species has made in recent years. An adult Red-headed Woodpecker in Madbury on October 30 was a more unusual find.

Most flycatchers were not well reported for the season, but two large concentrations of Eastern Kingbirds—16 in Littleton on August 10 and 50 in Canterbury on August 18—were reported.



## Wrens through Starling

Carolina Wrens continued their "invasion" north into New Hampshire. This season's total of 11 individuals was highlighted by two adults and three fledglings seen near a nest in Manchester. Among lingering late wrens were a Winter Wren in Durham on November 27 and two Marsh Wrens in Exeter on October 18.

Eastern Bluebirds continue to show encouraging signs of increases in their population. This fall, 268 birds were reported, with peak totals during the third week of October. Four birds had lingered in Durham through November 12. Four Gray-cheeked Thrushes in Pittsfield on September 20 represent an unusual sighting for this denizen of the mountains and rare migrant through the southern areas of the state.

A high count of 100 American Pipits were spotted at the sod farm in Canterbury on October 22, and three late Pipits were seen along the coast on November 21.

The Northern Shrike invasion of the last two falls did not repeat this year—one was reported for the season.

## Vireos through Towhee

The five Red-eyed Vireos in Gilsum on September 24 is a high number for the date, and the four Yellow-throated Vireos seen across two days in early September in Durham were unusual because all were singing!

Yellow-rumped Warblers were numerous, with a surprising total of 200 birds seen along the coast on October 15. A relatively late individual in Pittsfield on November 18 was found trapped in a garage, perhaps seeking shelter. Fourteen Black-throated Green Warblers in Enfield on September 19 is also an unusually high number.

Only one or two sightings of Chestnut-sided, Magnolia, Cape May, and Canada Warblers came in this season. It is difficult to say whether birders are not reporting these species or there's a real decline in their numbers. Recent concerns about Neotropical migrants make it important for observers to look for and report any warbler "waves."

Some unusual warblers provided excitement this fall. A Connecticut Warbler in Enfield is an excellent find for this rare and reclusive fall migrant from the west. The **Orange-crowned Warbler** is difficult to identify but was well-described by Star Island birders on September 20. Also, at least two **Yellow-breasted Chats**—in Rye on November 1 and in Bristol during the first week of November—were recorded for the fall. These dates are not unusually late for this rare wanderer from the southern United States.

Rose-breasted Grosbeaks had a strong showing with 10 reports of 51 birds, but only one Indigo Bunting was reported for the season.



# Sparrows through Blackbirds

Most members of the field trip to Star Island easily spotted the **Clay-colored Sparrow**, and although it is rare in New Hampshire, it is probably regular out on the Isles of Shoals. Savannah Sparrows peaked in mid-October; two flocks of 30 were seen on October 10. Two Savannah Sparrows of the "Ipswich" race were found in their restricted range along the coast on November 1. Seventy-five Song Sparrows on October 17 in Hanover and 50 on October 18 in Exeter represent good-sized flocks of this species. White-throated Sparrows were well-reported, with 36 reports comprising 114 birds. White-crowned Sparrows had their best fall in several years. The biggest single-day total—29 birds—came from Laconia on October 17.

Dark-eyed Juncos had a good fall, with one outstanding total of 182 birds in Littleton on October 17. The **Chestnut-collared Longspur** in Deering was the first sighting of this species in New Hampshire. Its normal range is the central US, and it's considered accidental in the East. Three hundred Snow Buntings along the coast is a typically high count on November 1, but a flock of 180 in Littleton is more unusual for the inland location.

Blackbirds also had a good fall; a mixed flock of 2,000 birds roosted in Laconia in mid-October, and an enormous flock of 5,000 blackbirds (presumed to be Red-winged Blackbirds) was seen moving south along the coast on November 1. A mostly male flock of 1,000 Grackles was reported in Durham on October 24, and a flock of 175 Brown-headed Cowbirds had occupied the same field in Durham two weeks earlier.

Winter finches were sparsely reported with no noteworthy numbers.


