

From the Editor

New Hampshire Bird Records is back on track! I can't believe I am finally saying this, but with the publication of this issue we are as up to date as possible. The next season is being written up by Fall Editor, Steve Mirick, and we are still receiving and computerizing sightings from Winter 94-95. A very heartfelt thanks to everyone who has volunteered, submitted sightings, and continued to support NH Bird Records. We will now have the challenge of staying on track and meeting more stringent publication deadlines.

I received some questions on the color of the last issue, Spring 94, so I'd like to explain our color scheme. There is some rhyme and reason to it all. Each year we publish four issues, beginning with the spring season and all issues from a given year have the same cover. When the year changes I choose a new paper for the cover. The inside pages change during the year but each season is always the same color. Spring has green pages, summer is blue, fall is yellow or orange, and winter is white. This has been fairly consistent throughout NH Bird Records history, with just a few deviations. The confusion with Spring 94 arose because the interior pages were white when they should have been green, according to our usual color scheme. Our printers called to tell me the issue was all done but that an error had been made on the color of the pages. They were happy to re-do the job but I could not see throwing out 4,000 pieces of paper and waiting another week for the issue. Thus Spring 94 has white pages and we have saved all that paper.

The Breeding Bird Survey data is once again in graph format and we have had positive feedback on this approach. Please let us know what you

think. Thanks!

Overall, this season's weather was moderate and did not seem to have any adverse effects on breeding birds. In these records, the most significant change from past summers was the presence of more good field observers in the White Mountain National Forest (WMNF), most as part of a formal survey of breeding birds. As in the past, this intensive work produced some outstanding counts of many northern birds, but it also brought up several questions as well. See the individual species accounts for details.

Another fascinating phenomenon is the amazing mix of southern and northern species at Pawtuckaway State Park. Not only is it a coastal bastion of birds more common in northern New Hampshire, such as Raven, Blackburnian Warbler, and Evening Grosbeak, but this season it was also host to southern rarities: two Cerulean Warblers and a Worm-eating Warbler. The highlight of the summer season was the discovery of a Merlin nest in the Lake Umbagog area. This is the first confirmed nesting of this species in New Hampshire. Statewide, other rare reports included Rufous Hummingbird, Red-headed Woodpecker, Sedge Wren, Grasshopper Sparrow, and Pine Grosbeak.

As with last summer's records, we have formatted the Breeding Bird Survey data in graphs. Let us know if this effort is appreciated.

Loon through Herons

A calling Pied-billed Grebe in Hollis on June 1 brings the number of potential nesting sites for the species to 11 in the last five years. An immature Great Cormorant was an unusual but not unprecedented inland find at Bow Lake. The Great Egret numbers along the coast reflect a continuing increase of this species in southern New England, and one seen by this editor in Canterbury was the fifth one in the last six years during late summer/early fall. Forty-four Snowy Egrets at Adams Point was an impressive tally, as was five Black-crowned Night-Herons in Durham just below the Mill Pond. But Glossy Ibis reports were low; is this because they are rare, or are they being under-reported?

Waterfowl through Hawks

Five families comprised the 35 Wood Ducks in Moultonborough. Two male Green-winged Teal from East Inlet in Pittsburg were the only teal species reported this season. The two reports of 11 Ring-necked Ducks were believed to be the same family group. Has the duck population at Lake Umbagog crashed? That locale should generate more reports of Greenwinged and Blue-winged Teal, Ring-necked Ducks, and Common Goldeneye.

Just over half the total of Common Eiders at Star Island were ducklings. Although Common Mergansers nest fairly frequently on the larger lakes, the lone female on the Merrimack River and the family on the Ashuelot River

were unusual.

Several Turkey Vultures in Pittsburg pushed the range of this species to the northern limit of the state. The Endangered Species Program reported a banner year for Osprey, with a record high number of active nest sites (29) and young(44), including six young from Great Bay. Another very healthy sign is that seven Osprey nesting pairs produced three young each (most pairs produce one or two).

By now you have probably heard the story of the Bald Eagles at Lake Umbagog. This summer the same pair that nested in New Hampshire for the past five years moved to the Maine side of the lake. Then the male (known as "YT") disappeared and the nest was abandoned. The female eventually paired up with a younger male, but they did not nest this year. YT's remains

were found later in the summer.

Northern Harriers made news with a total of 12 confirmed young (the most in at least five years), with five of those young coming from one nest (Pontook). A Northern Harrier in Gilsum on July 31 was an early migrant. A Cooper's Hawk in Enfield was carrying prey toward a specific area, which led the observer to suspect a nesting bird. However, no proof of nesting for Cooper's Hawks came from anywhere in the state.

All nesting records of hawks are valuable for our files, but space limits the number we can print. Several Red-tailed Hawk nests were observed on power line towers during an aerial survey this year. The most interesting American Kestrel report came from the summit of Mount Cardigan. With record high numbers of sites (10) and productive nests (5), Peregrine Falcons had another good breeding season. The most exciting raptor report was that of a pair of Merlins on a nest near Lake Umbagog. This is the first confirmed nesting of the species in New Hampshire and follows four years of suspicious sightings.

Grouse through Cuckoos

The Caps Ridge Trail on the western side of Mount Jefferson was one of the best places to see Spruce Grouse this summer, but not every birding party that made the climb found that elusive species. The only unusual thing about the Virginia Rail observed on July 12 was that it was "heard overhead" at 11:00 pm!

You will have to tune in next summer to find out what happened to the young Killdeer in Littleton. They hatched on the roof of a three-story building, jumped off, and were rushed to a veterinarian by the local police, but the observers "...had to leave before the drama was over." The three Snipe in Dublin were south of their usual nesting range, but that's not totally sur-

prising given the 1000-foot elevation of the area.

No unusual migrant shorebirds were noted. In fact, on July 2 one coastal observer who hoped to see some early migrants saw only one species of shorebird: a Willet, which nests in our coastal marshes. Note, however, the end of the northward Black-bellied Plover migration (June 12) and the beginning of the south-bound Black-bellieds (July 31), as well as the good variety of common migrant shore birds after July 2. The three Laughing Gulls at the coast and the Bonaparte's Gull at Errol are typical wanderers for July. An adult Least Tern feeding another adult hints of breeding, especially since the species has been seen in that same area of Seabrook several times. Successful species are highly adaptable, as the pair of Mourning Doves that nested on top of a compressor pipe in a boiler room in Nashua demonstrated!

Writing on the birds of the Monadnock region in 1909, Gerald Thayer said of the Black-billed Cuckoo, "This is the most mysterious bird in America. I will do one month's hard labor, free of charge, for anybody who explains him to me....Here in Dublin there is no other overhead night sound one-half so common." A.C. Bent's Life Histories of North American Cuckoos, Goatsuckers, Hummingbirds and their Allies reports that "...the little gurgle is their usual sky-note." During the 1994's summer, this editor found two road-killed Black-billed Cuckoos within 10 feet of each other on the morning of July 22, and Pete Hunt had six night flyers on July 12 and 13. Since they are known to be later migrants, what explains this nocturnal wandering? Just the mysteries of the cuckoo.



Owls through Woodpeckers

A Common Nighthawk in Durham on June 16 was termed unusual by the observer because he does not know of any nearby nesting sites. Meanwhile, Chimney Swifts were noted staging for their south-bound migration on July 16 in Gilsum. A male **Rufous Hummingbird** spent about a week at a feeder in Warner, where it was photographed and seen by a number of observers. This is only the fourth or fifth New Hampshire record of this extreme rarity from the West.

Judging by recent records, Red-headed Woodpeckers are now rarer than Red-bellied Woodpeckers in southern New Hampshire, and even though Red-headeds have been seen annually for decades, they have never been common. Evidence for this is the fact that the **Red-headed Woodpecker** seen at Audubon House June 1 was only the second one ever recorded by Tudor Richards in New Hampshire (both at Audubon House) and only the fourth in New Hampshire for Kimball Elkins. Combined, Tudor and Kimball have almost 150 years of birding experience in the state!

Flycatchers through Swallows

Flycatchers as a group are late spring migrants, as demonstrated by the Olive-sided Flycatcher in Deering on June 2 and another in Concord on June 11. Some of the Least Flycatchers and Eastern Wood-Pewees at Pawtuckaway State Park on June 5 could also have been late migrants still working their way north. At the other end of the migration swing were wandering flycatchers preparing to move south in late July, including a Wood-Pewee and Eastern Kingbird on July 24 in Canterbury. A Willow Flycatcher in Whitefield was somewhat farther north than usual, and an Eastern Phoebe at an elevation of 3600 feet in the White Mountains was also out of the ordinary. Thanks to the field workers in the WMNF being at the right place at the right time, many more than the usual number of Yellow-bellied Flycatchers were reported.

Tree Swallows were noted flocking in preparation for migrating on July 17, 24, and 27 (which is typical), but a brood of fledglings was observed on July 30 in Kensington (atypical for this species, which often departs inland areas by the end of July). The 64 Cliff Swallows in Enfield represent two colonies.



Jays through Gnatcatcher

The surveys in the WMNF also helped give us higher than usual numbers for the Gray Jay, another rare local resident. This was a very encouraging showing for a species that has been of concern in recent years. American Crows continue to flourish, perhaps because they are smart. You may remember last summer's story about the piratical crows at the Laconia Country Club. Well, the observer from the links reports in 1994 that the crows "...have not solved the beer-can problem yet. They are unable to drink, but they do enjoy the food." Sightings of two Fish Crows in Concord in late June and as many as five or six in mid-July provided strong evidence of nesting without any positive proof.

At least one of the Sedge Wrens first discovered in May in Kensington was still singing well into June. A Blue-gray Gnatcatcher in Stratford was quite far north but in appropriate riparian habitat along the Connecticut River.

Thrushes through Vireos


The intrepid birders-in-the-mountains also reported more Gray-cheeked Thrushes than usual. However, a Gray-cheek seen on June 9 along the Tripoli Road in Thornton was probably a late spring migrant because it was at a low elevation. After several years of asking for Brown Thrasher sightings, this editor was gratified by the number reported, including a pair in Pittsburg. The American Pipits seem to be well established on Mount Washington, their southernmost breeding grounds in eastern North America.

The rarer vireos (Yellow-throated and Philadelphia) were well reported. A Warbling Vireo was at the northern edge of its range in Pittsburg, while a Philadelphia was south of its known range in Sandwich.

Warblers =

A Golden-winged Warbler banded in the WMNF on June 16 shows how inexplicable birds can be. For no clear reason, it was well north of its very limited New Hampshire range on a date when it should have been feeding young. And despite being in an area that was receiving intensive study, it was not seen before or after that date. A Northern Parula at Pawtuckaway State Park on June 5 was probably a late migrant. The Cape May Warbler along the Kancamagus Highway was at a rather low elevation considering it was the only one reported this summer. A Blackburnian Warbler in Canterbury July 31 was a south-bound wanderer. Al and Barbara Delorey counted a high number of Prairie Warblers (14) in shrubby growth underneath power lines in the southeastern part of the state, the state's best habitat for this species. Also note their Field Sparrow numbers.

Two singing male Cerulean Warblers and a singing male Worm-eating Warbler, holdovers from the spring season, add to the mystique of Pawtuckaway State Park. This is about the fourth time Ceruleans have been seen there in the last 10 years, and with two males present, perhaps they have nested. Let's find out in 1995.

American Redstarts seemed to be further down in numbers than in the recent past, but there was an abundance of Ovenbirds. This is puzzling—both are Neotropical migrants and therefore species of concern. This is just a further example of the complexity of bird trend analysis. Besides harboring rare warbler species, Pawtuckaway is an excellent place for listening to both species of waterthrushes. A Louisiana Waterthrush at Kiah Pond in Sandwich is almost as unusual for this bird of southern New Hampshire as the Philadelphia Vireo discovered there.

Mourning Warblers are secretive and late migrants, making their movements hard to explain. For instance, the single bird in Pittsburg on June 4 might have been a precursor to the main flight, as suggested by the seven there on June 10 and 11. But because Pittsburg is such a big place, that is only conjecture. The Mourning Warbler in New London on June 17 was south of its normal range, thereby muddying the waters even more. More Wilson's Warblers were reported than in most summers, albeit all from breeding grounds in Pittsburg except for a very late migrant in Durham on June 12.

Tanagers through Evening Grosbeak

A male Scarlet Tanager at Pawtuckaway State Park was seen biting the tail of a female tanager in an apparent territorial squabble. A singing male Grasshopper Sparrow in Merrimack was a nice find for this rare and very local breeder. Once again the Dark-eyed Junco went unreported from its common breeding grounds (the mountains and northward); southern reports of juncos included a nest in Newbury. For the second year in a row a Bobolink was seen in a Lake Umbagog wetland. See the Summer 1993 report for ruminations about this phenomenon.

For several summers this editor has been asking for Eastern Meadowlark reports, with little response. So I went to several fields in the Dover area where they occur and found 32 separate meadowlarks in three visits. Reports for the rest of the state totaled four.

Surprisingly, no Rusty Blackbirds were reported from the White Mountains or Kiah Pond in Sandwich (historically a good place for them). Have they become that scarce? Two male Orchard Orioles in Newmarket at a traditional spot comprise the total report. George Gavutis in Kensington had two nesting pairs of Northern Orioles in one tree and a third pair in the next tree.

A rare summer record of Pine Grosbeak came from the Cherry Pond area in Whitefield—there are only a handful of summer records for this species. The Evening Grosbeak continues to be an enigma in that almost all reports came from the southern part of the state, even with all the observers in the mountains and North Country. Please help us determine what's going on with this species by submitting detailed reports. Thanks.




Breeding Bird Survey Data (1966-94)


The following graphs are for different species than in the Summer 93 issue. The graphs show the total number of birds detected on all routes each year. Some species show obvious increases (e.g. Northern Cardinal) while others show decreases (e.g. Barn Swallow, Vesper Sparrow). However, the majority of these species show no obvious trends (e.g. Great Crested Flycatcher, Eastern Kingbird). It is interesting to note that a number of species seem to show cyclic variations (e.g. Rose-breasted Grosbeak).








