

To our Observers

More than half of all sightings submitted in this Fall '94 issue are not published simply because there is not enough room. As seasonal editor, I sort through all the sightings and choose those records which present the best picture of bird activity during that fall. But ALL records are maintained in the central database and on file in Concord for reference. If your sightings are not included in the report, please do not feel offended. Your reports are still vitally important*—please continue to submit them.

Now that *New Hampshire Bird Records* is up to date, it is imperative that sightings are submitted on a timely basis. As editors, we have very tight deadlines to meet. Ideally, sightings should be submitted monthly to Becky Suomala at Audubon House in Concord. The worst case should be that sightings arrive in Concord within three days of the end of the season. Late records will be added to the database and archived — but we will not be able to consider them for publication in *New Hampshire Bird Records*. The *New Hampshire Bird Records* Season Editors are forming a New Hampshire Rare Bird Committee to review rare sightings. We are meeting to choose committee members, establish procedures, and formulate guidelines. You will be hearing more about this as details are finalized and the Committee begins reviewing sightings.

* ASNH uses this database for a number of different projects. Sightings from species that we actively monitor, such as Bald Eagles, Ospreys, and Peregrine Falcons, are routed to the Wildlife & Wetlands Department staff. In February, the department requested a printout of Great Bay sightings for a habitat protection proposal. We also receive requests from outside researchers, such as the request for spring Bank Swallow sightings that we responded to in March. Although the slips may seem time consuming and tedious, they make the data more accessible and valuable.

Fall Season

August 1 - November 30, 1994

The fall season began with a seasonable August, with temperatures near average and rainfall slightly below normal. A strong cold front toward the end of the month triggered cool weather during the first week of September and may have been the catalyst for waves of warblers noted in Hopkinton on September 1 and in Sandwich on September 3. Another strong front on September 10 was followed by numbers of warblers and vireos on September 11. Waves were reported from East Kingston, Enfield, and Center Harbor, and the first big kettles of hawks started down the coast under strong northwest winds.

Cool weather persisted into early October, but temperatures were well above normal by the end of the month and remained so into the end of November. In fact, it was the warmest November recorded in New England since 1979, and, as records for a number of species indicate, many migrants were late in getting started. Some exceptionally late neotropical migrants that lingered into November included two Barn Swallows, a Red-eyed Vireo, a Nashville Warbler, an American Redstart, and a Rose-breasted Grosbeak.

Unfortunately, the fact that most species migrate at night makes observing migrating birds difficult. Patient observers can go out under a bright, full moon during the fall and focus a spotting scope at low power on the moon's surface. If the birds are migrating, you can see their silhouettes clearly as they pass across the moon. Alternatively, you can use your ears: many species use call notes to maintain flocks during migration, and some species can even be identified this way. The peak of migration is reported to be between 11:00 and midnight, and birds tend to be more easily heard during overcast and foggy conditions after a front has passed. Peter Hunt, who climbed onto his roof in Enfield on several nights during September and conducted one-hour surveys of night migration, was able to document the night migration of over 1,000 warblers and thrushes!

Warblers and thrushes weren't the only well-reported species for this season—there was excellent coverage for most families of birds, and in most areas of the state. We received 2,349 bird records for the season, an indication of the continued enthusiasm for birds and bird records in New Hampshire. With this good coverage, it is not surprising that several rarities were reported. Just a few highlights include a Leach's Storm Petrel on Great Bay, the state's first Eurasian Wigeon since 1954, two Rufous Hummingbirds, a Yellow-headed Blackbird, and a juvenile Curlew Sandpiper.

Loons through Herons

One hundred Red-throated Loons seen migrating down the coast on November 6 represents the highest total in several years, but the report is not that unusual for this species at this time of year. Pied-billed Grebes were well-reported again this fall, with very large concentrations from Stubb's Pond and Canobie Lake. Low numbers of Wilson's Storm-Petrels and Greater Shearwaters were reported from the few pelagic trips, but the two Northern Fulmars seen from a whale-watch boat on September 22 are the first records in several years. A Leach's Storm-Petrel was an extremely rare find out in the middle of Great Bay on October 15. The bird was seen swimming and then flying around the bay under calm winds. Usually, these rare birds are found this far inland only after storms with strong northeasterly winds. The two hundred Northern Gannets seen migrating south along the coast on the same day represent an interesting coincidence because both species are pelagic.

Heron highlights for the fall include a Tricolored Heron along the coast in Seabrook Harbor, a young Least Bittern at the Exeter waste water treatment plant, and a late inland Cattle Egret in Warren on November 13. Ten inland Great Egrets is also a good total for the fall.

Hawks

Ospreys were well-reported, with a remarkable total of 69 seen migrating past Odiorne Point in Rye on September 11. Good numbers of Bald Eagles were also seen, with 22 total individuals reported (not including many of the sightings from hawk watches). Sharp-shinned Hawk totals were not quite as good as last fall's from Odiorne, but coverage was not as extensive as it was last year.

It was another great Broad-winged Hawk flight this fall, with the majority of birds passing through on September 14 and 15. The flight of birds on September 14 was late in the day and very concentrated in the central part of the state: in two hours in New Boston, 2,362 were counted; in Auburn, 1100 were counted in one-half hour; and near Pack Monadnock, 2,000+ birds were counted between 5:15 and 5:45 PM! The next day, Broad-winged Hawks were everywhere in this section of the state: the total of 4,097 from New Boston nearly matched last year's record total from East Deering. Red-tailed Hawks were not well-reported, and no major migration was noted, despite some decent hawk watch coverage from Dan Crook in Lebanon. A rare immature Golden Eagle was seen migrating in Nottingham on October 16.

The now famous Manchester Peregrine Falcon, nicknamed "Alex," returned to the NYNEX microwave antenna for at least its fifth consecutive winter on September 12.

Pheasant through Terns

Spruce Grouse (six young birds) were once again reported from Mt. Chocorua, where the species is at its southern extent of its range. Two Virginia Rails were reported very late, with one reported just a bit too late: the bird found in Cambridge on November 27 was dead, probably hit by a car just after a snow fall. The two Common Moorhens represent good finds for this declining species, especially as far north as Lake Umbagog on August 26. American Coots were reported in excellent numbers for the fall, with the bulk of the birds reported from the three best locations of Eel Pond, Powwow Pond, and Stubb's Pond.

Seven different Buff-breasted Sandpipers were reported for the fall, including five individuals seen at once (the highest number since at least 1965) at the end of the runway at the Pease International Tradeport on September 3. A Marbled Godwit roosting side by side with a Hudsonian Godwit in Seabrook on September 9 was a rare find, and a phalarope on Lake Umbagog was photographed on September 4. Initially the bird was thought to be a Red-necked, but the bird's identity remains controversial despite the photographs, and Red Phalarope is a possibility. On October 15, a late Red-necked Phalarope was more easily identified at Great Boar's Head along the coast, a more typical location. A one-day occurrence of a juvenile Curlew Sandpiper at Seabrook Harbor on September 7 created a lot of excitement. The bird was observed well and heard feeding on the mud flats; unfortunately, it could not be relocated the next day despite extensive searching. Only a couple of previous sightings of this species have been recorded in the state.

Gulls and terns were largely uneventful for the fall; the few notable reports include an immature Black-legged Kittiwake sitting in the grasses of a picnic area in New Castle on October 25, two Arctic Terns seen offshore on September 7, and a very late Black Tern in Derry on September 29.

Wrens through Starling

Perhaps a result of the harsh winter of 1993-94, only three Carolina Wrens were reported this fall, down from last year's total of 12. A House Wren was exceptionally late on October 28 in Rye. A good total of 56 Golden-crowned Kinglets from the White Mountains on November 6 was reported, and 50 Ruby-crowned Kinglets from the coast on October 12 is the highest total in several years.

A good total of 232 Eastern Bluebirds came in this fall, with an amazing 61 birds reported in November. Not only are we seeing more bluebirds than we did 10 years ago, but more of them are also staying through the fall and winter. Veeries and Swainson's and Hermit thrushes, with their distinctive nocturnal flight call notes, were picked up in night migration by Pete Hunt on three nights in September.

An American Pipit seen on Mt. Hight on August 4 is intriguing because they are known to nest only near the summit of Mt. Washington. Another individual in Newington on August 29 was a very early migrant. Rebounding from the very low numbers of the last two falls, seven Northern Shrikes were reported this season. One well-documented bird seen on October 8 was remarkably early for this winter visitor.

Vireos through Towhee

Warblers were well-reported, with several waves of migrants noted. Migration during September was documented by Pete Hunt as he performed one-hour nocturnal surveys in Enfield; a peak of 715 birds in one hour on September 8 were identified by their flight call notes. Five Yellow-breasted Chat sightings represent a high total for this southern warbler. Very late reports were received for several species: some of the most unusual include a Red-eyed Vireo in Durham on November 13, nine October records of Black-throated Blue Warbler, a Nashville Warbler on November 12, a Bay-breasted Warbler in Rye on October 12, and an American Redstart on November 20! A warbler of the *Oporornis* genus in Columbia on October 6 was thought to be a very late Mourning Warbler, but the description does not rule out the remote possibility of MacGillivray's Warbler.

A late Rose-breasted Grosbeak was unusual up in Dixville on November 7, and two Blue Grosbeaks reported from Exeter represent a rare fall sighting for this species.

Sparrows, Blackbirds, and Finches

Sparrow numbers were not exceptional, and no large concentrations were noted. A few rarities were reported, however, including a Grasshopper Sparrow in Rye, a Lark Sparrow in Newington, and a late Clay-colored Sparrow in Stratham on November 5.

An adult male Yellow-headed Blackbird made a brief but memorable appearance at a feeder in Conway on August 18. There are only a few records for this species in New Hampshire. Blackbirds are known for their gregarious nature, but the numbers reported from Chester in late October may be record-breaking—two independent observers reported a tremendous flock of blackbirds, probably both part of the same group of Common Grackles. A continuous river of birds flowed south down Derry Road for about 30 minutes each evening for at least six consecutive days; the total was estimated by one observer at 32,700 and by the other at 105,600. The similar sizes and timing of these flights suggest one enormous flock of birds returning each evening to a roost site rather than different migratory flocks.

Good numbers of siskins and crossbills were reported from northern New Hampshire for the fall, but other finches were not as common. Purple Finches were found only in northern parts of the state. With no reports at all, redpolls took a nose dive from the last year's invasion, and only 36 Evening Grosbeaks were reported for the season.




