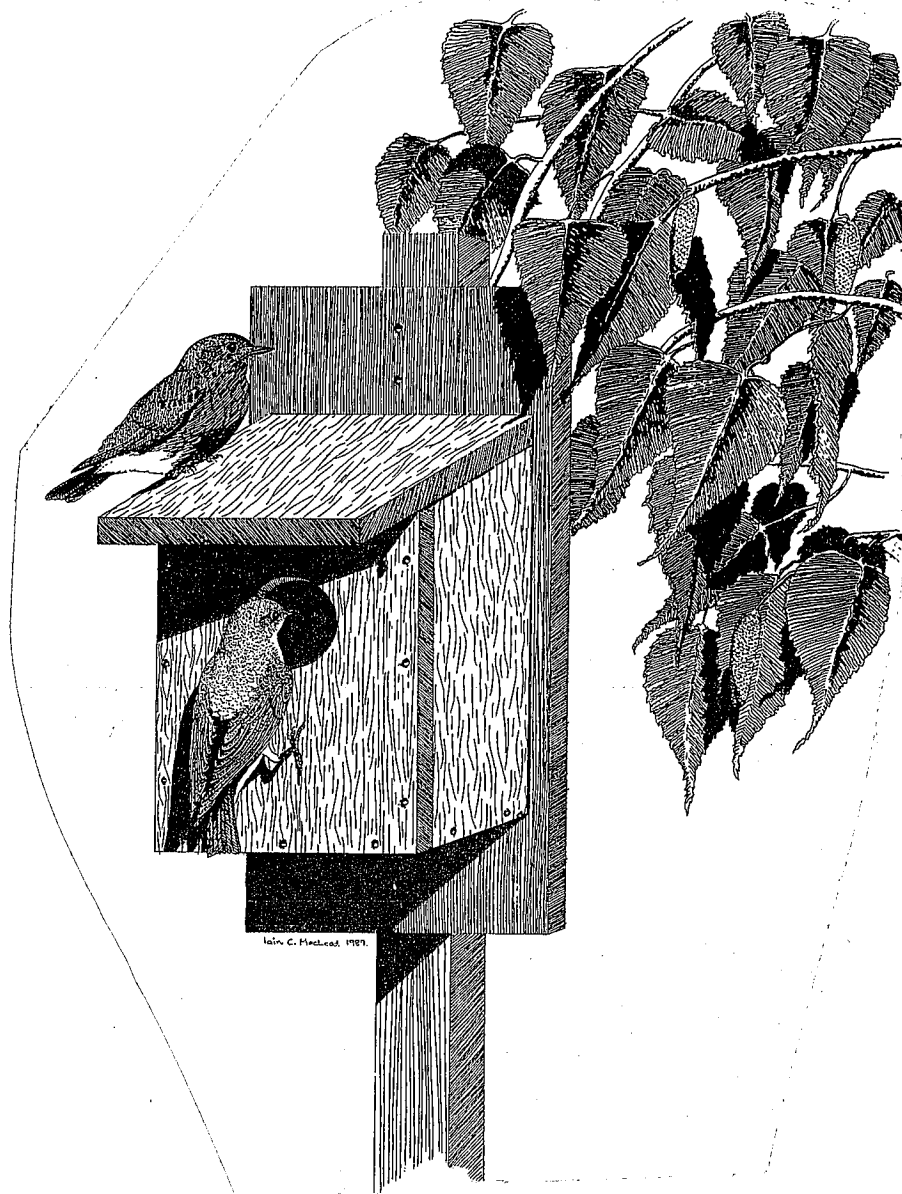

Compiling *New Hampshire Bird Records*

We continue our quest to publish the *New Hampshire Bird Records* on a timely schedule of four issues per year. Despite the lack of visible results, we have made great strides behind the scenes. Data entry for all seasons is up to date, we are preparing the first two 1990 seasons for publication, and all other seasons are with their seasonal editors. We appreciate your continued patience and support.

If you are not familiar with the *New Hampshire Bird Records*, a brief outline of the procedure follows. All bird sighting slips are received at Audubon House and entered into the computer. The computer printout then goes to the seasonal editor, who interprets the information and writes it up. It is then returned to ASNH where it is readied for final publication. Timely submission (monthly) of bird report slips greatly facilitates this process. A detailed explanation of the reporting procedures can be sent to any interested birder. If you have not reported and would like to receive this information, please contact Becky or Diane at ASNH.

We are excited to report that the number of sightings submitted continues to climb, with over 2000 received for spring of 1990. In response, we have had to implement a more rigorous editing format to keep down the cost of each issue. This means that not every record received will be in the published manuscript. However, each record will be computerized and archived in the files. All records are still of great historical value and it is still extremely important to maintain statewide coverage.

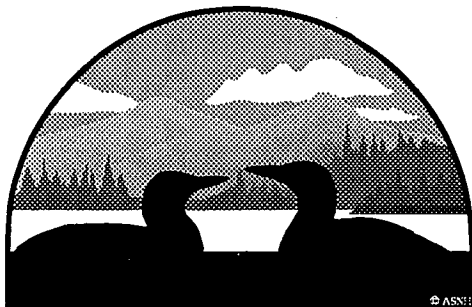
In the 1989 seasons you will find that entire species groups have been deleted. The phenomenon of missing groups results from a need to save space in the final publication, and reflects those species where reports were of little significance. A list of the missing groups and the names of all reporters can be found at the end of each season. Anyone who would like a copy of the full computer printout for a season may obtain one for a small fee. Please contact us directly if you are interested in this service.

We would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to all the many volunteers who helped make this publication possible. We could not do it without them. A special thank you goes to Ruth Lang, Tom McMillan, Marie Neveu, Jill Simmons, and the four seasonal editors. Front and back cover illustrations are by Iain C. MacLeod. Thank you also to those who have made special monetary contributions to *Bird Records*. These go into a restricted fund which is used exclusively for *New Hampshire Bird Records*. This kind of support is extremely important and very much appreciated.

Spring Season

March 1 through May 31, 1989

Spring, 1989, was not a collection of typical months. March and April were both colder than they were over the last few years, and May brought more rainfall than it has since the last century. Spring migrants, however, arrived undaunted.

Temperatures were below normal for most of March, and the winter's dry weather continued to prevail. While it was the coldest March since 1984 for the region as a whole, the final week of the month brought temperatures more reminiscent of June as strong southwesterly winds blew across New England.

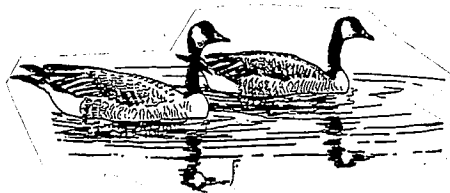
These warm winds also ushered in some migrants, with significant movements of **Snow Geese** being especially notable. A high of 500 were reported from Rindge, with good numbers moving along the Connecticut River as well. **Canada Geese** also used these winds for northward movement, as 1000 were reported from the Connecticut River in Hanover. These same southwesterlies marked the beginning of the songbird migration as good numbers of **Eastern Phoebes**, **American Robins**, and **Tree Swallows** pushed into New Hampshire during the first few days of April.

After the first couple of days of April, temperatures fell and stayed relatively low, giving the Granite State its coolest April since 1982. Although precipitation was near normal for the month, it was generally characterized by a series of lows that brought cloudy, cool conditions and light precipitation in the form of rain or snow. This may have been a factor in the "trickle through" hawk movement—no significant pushes were recorded through the spring. In contrast, waterfowl numbers were higher than normal, with strong showings by less common species such as the **Northern Pintail** and **Gadwall**.

"Rain" was the word for the month of May, 1989: the combined May total for all three northern New England states was the highest on record (beginning in 1895). The persistent cloud cover moderated temperatures, producing the warmest May since 1960. Warbler migration seemed to progress normally, with no obvious waves recorded (possibly due to the lack of any significant weather fronts for them to move along).

Highlights for the season included individuals from a number of groups. A male **Common Chaffinch** was reported in Oxford on May 7—this is a first for New Hampshire and is only the fifth regional sighting on record. A **Golden Eagle** seen in Franconia Notch in early April also generated excitement. Other highlights included a **Prothonotary Warbler** in the Hinsdale marsh, two **Red-bellied Woodpeckers**, and two northern **Red-headed Woodpecker** reports.

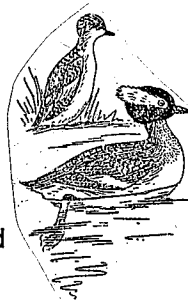


Loons and Grebes

A group of eight lingering **Red-throated Loons** were seen off Newcastle on May 31. The arrival of the **Common Loon** on inland waters corresponded well with the breakup of ice. With the exception of two sightings in the Umbagog region, there were no large groups of Common Loons reported.

Pied-billed Grebes, listed as an endangered species in New Hampshire, made an encouraging showing, with over 30 individuals reported this spring. The first sightings came from the Merrimack River area during the last week in March. A **Western Grebe** along the Rye coastline on March 22 was a surprisingly late sighting.

Cormorants through Herons

No pelagic species were reported this spring, most likely the result of no offshore birding trips. **Great Cormorants** lingered into late March, overlapping **Double-crested Cormorants** returning for the breeding season.

Great Blue Herons were well reported as they moved back in during the second half of March. Increasing numbers of **Glossy Ibis** in New England set the stage for two reports from the White Mountains region: one individual moved through Franconia Notch on April 5, while a second was reported from Ossipee on April 30. A confirmed breeding record from the Seacoast area for the **Least Bittern** and a well-described, but not officially verified, sighting of an individual in Laconia were exciting.

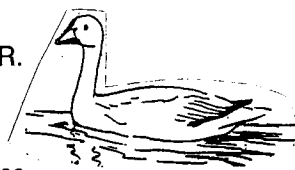


Waterfowl

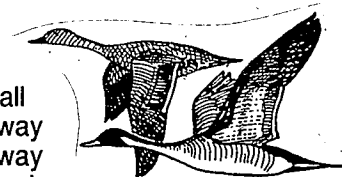
Waterfowl reports were excellent this spring. Ideal conditions set the stage for some significant **Snow** and **Canada Goose** migrations in the last part of March. Two separate sightings of **Brant** in the last few days of May were relatively late dates for this species.

Wood Ducks, Green-winged Teal, Blue-winged Teal, Ring-necked Ducks, and Hooded Mergansers were all reported in good numbers. Among waterfowl species less commonly seen in New Hampshire, the **Northern Pintail** made a strong showing with 24 reported; two sightings each of **Northern Shoveler** and **Gadwall** were heartening; and **American Wigeon** were reported in good numbers, with a high of 12 individuals seen along the Merrimack River on April 11.

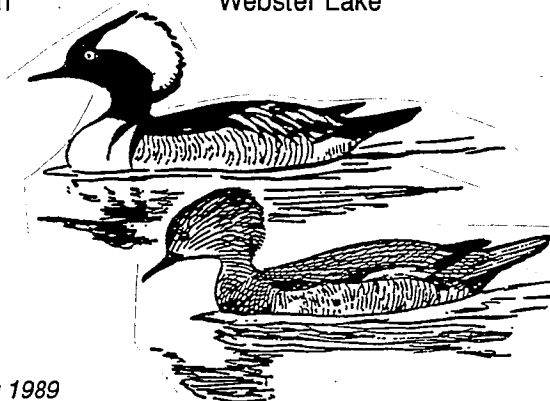

Hawks

This group gave us plenty of excitement during the spring, even though the lack of any significant weather fronts during April most likely contributed to the "trickle through" hawk migration. However, the **Osprey** migration across southern New Hampshire to northern breeding locations was well-reported. And **Turkey Vulture** numbers continue to climb as they expand their breeding range across the state.

The most gratifying trend is among breeding populations of three raptor species that are rebounding after having been decimated by DDT use. Ospreys nested in the coastal region for the first time since early in the century. Although this pair was not successful, we are very hopeful that their attempt will mark the beginning of Osprey recolonization along New Hampshire's coast.

Even more exciting, however, was the **Bald Eagle** chick that hatched in a nest on Lake Umbagog. The adults nested in the same tree that was home to New Hampshire's last breeding eagles 40 years ago. Like the coastal Ospreys, the Bald Eagles lost their young, but a fostered eaglet fledged successfully.

And **Peregrine Falcons** continued their comeback by occupying seven cliff sites across the state. It is heartening to document the resurgence of these species.

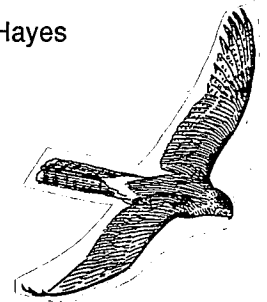
As if all this were not excitement enough, a **Golden Eagle** was reported from Franconia Notch.

Grouse through Terns

The **Wild Turkey** continues to be reported from expanding regions of the state. Rail reports were few, but sightings of **Common Moorhens** in both Orford and Nottingham were notable for this rather uncommon species.

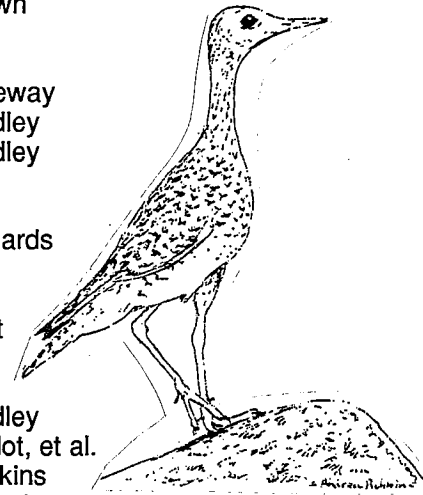
Shorebirds were only scantily reported, making it difficult to comment on their migration. Increased observation at Pease Air Force Base, the only known breeding area for **Upland Sandpipers**, yielded a high of 15 birds this spring. An Upland Sandpiper observed along the Contoocook River floodplain was also notable. A total of 12 **Common Snipe** along the Connecticut River in Charlestown on April 8 was a good indication of their migration.

Two **Least Terns** at Seabrook on May 20 was an excellent sighting.

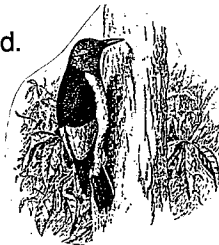


Cuckoos through Woodpeckers

A good number of **Common Nighthawk** reports in the last few days of May was evidence of their northward movement; the high was a sighting of 20 reported from a field in Amherst. **Whip-poor-will** reports continue to be low—please let us know if you are hearing them so we can get a more accurate estimate of their population.

This season's highlights from this group are in the woodpecker family. Two **Red-bellied Woodpeckers** were observed and are perhaps a sign of the slow northward migration of this species. Perhaps most remarkable were the sightings of two **Red-headed Woodpeckers**, from Conway and Monroe. This woodpecker species visits New Hampshire at rare intervals; their stronghold is considerably south and west of the state.

Flycatchers through Wrens

The flycatcher migration was on schedule, for the most part. Strong southwesterlies during the last week of March helped push good numbers of **Eastern Phoebes** into the state ahead of schedule. A number of **Olive-sided Flycatcher** reports help paint a picture of their distribution. Most other flycatcher returns came during the second week of May.

We hope the lack of any **Purple Martin** reports is not an indication of further slippage in their population. The first **Tree Swallow** sighting came from the Seacoast on March 26, but numbers peaked in the middle of April. **Northern Rough-winged Swallow** sightings came from a number of locations.

Corvid movement is probably much more prevalent than expressed in the numbers received. **Fish Crow** sightings may reflect a northward range expansion for this species, including a possible nesting in Concord. **Common Raven** reports reflect continued southward movement with an unusually high number of 45 in Rindge.

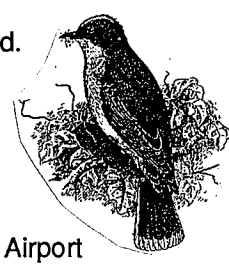
The presence of four **Carolina Wrens** during the spring season may be a sign of imminent breeding. But the highlight of this group must be the **Sedge Wren** singing in Cascade Marsh.

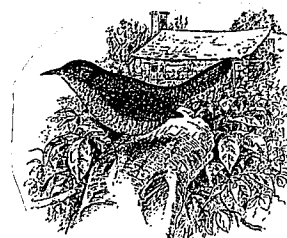
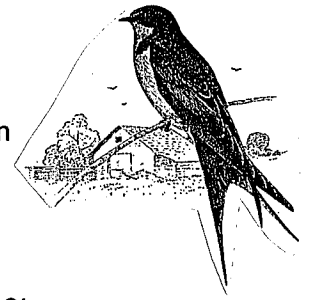

Kinglets through Vireos

Reports indicate that the **Ruby-crowned Kinglet** migration occurred during the last few days of April. **Eastern Bluebird** numbers, though edited for this publication, indicate a continued strengthening of their New Hampshire populations. The **American Robin** migration peaked during the normal period from late March through early April. A **Varied Thrush**, which breeds along the West Coast, was sighted in Dunbarton on April 12. It was well-described but has not been officially verified.

A **Bohemian Waxwing** in Durham on March 19 was a surprise after a winter when few were seen in the state. A well-described **Loggerhead Shrike** in Sandwich was also a notable sighting, as this species has undergone a major decline across New England.

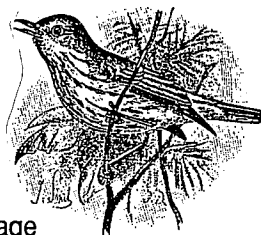

Warblers

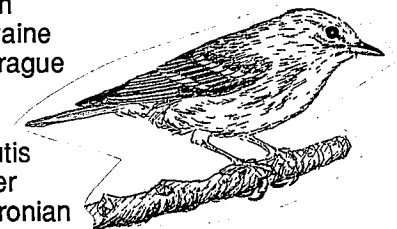
Warblers were under-reported, but all indications are that migration progressed as usual, with the majority of movement occurring in mid-May. Perhaps the rainy weather deterred our usual warbler watchers.

A well-described, but as yet unofficial, **Connecticut Warbler** was seen in Loudon on May 5. The most extraordinary sighting from this group was of a **Prothonotary Warbler** seen by Diane Touret in a marsh in Hinsdale on May 5. This southern species was also seen in West Haven, Vermont, on May 20. A well-described **Yellow-throated Warbler** was seen in Monroe but additional details for verification were not submitted.

Tanagers through Evening Grosbeak

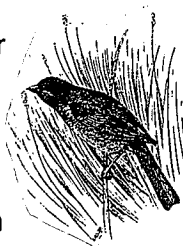
Sparrows were lightly reported through the migration period, although the southwest-erly flow of air during the latter part of March probably contributed to an excellent showing of **Fox Sparrows** during this period.

Snow Buntings made a decent showing in March, with groups reported from around the state. The warm days of late March also ushered in a few **Eastern Meadowlarks**. Blackbird migration progressed as usual, but a number of **Rusty Blackbird** reports were notable. **Orchard Orioles** were present in scattered locations, including a northern record from Lyman. This may be another southern species whose range is expanding.

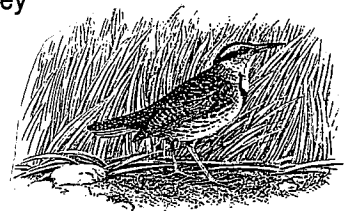
Perhaps the most interesting sighting of the season belongs to this group. A **Common Chaffinch** was observed (and well-documented, with photographs) in Orford on May 7. Byron Butler sighted the adult male feeding alongside **White-throated Sparrows** on seeds spilled from the feeder. The Chaffinch is a Eurasian breeder, with only eight records of North American sightings.

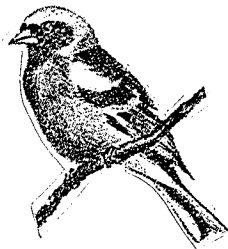
