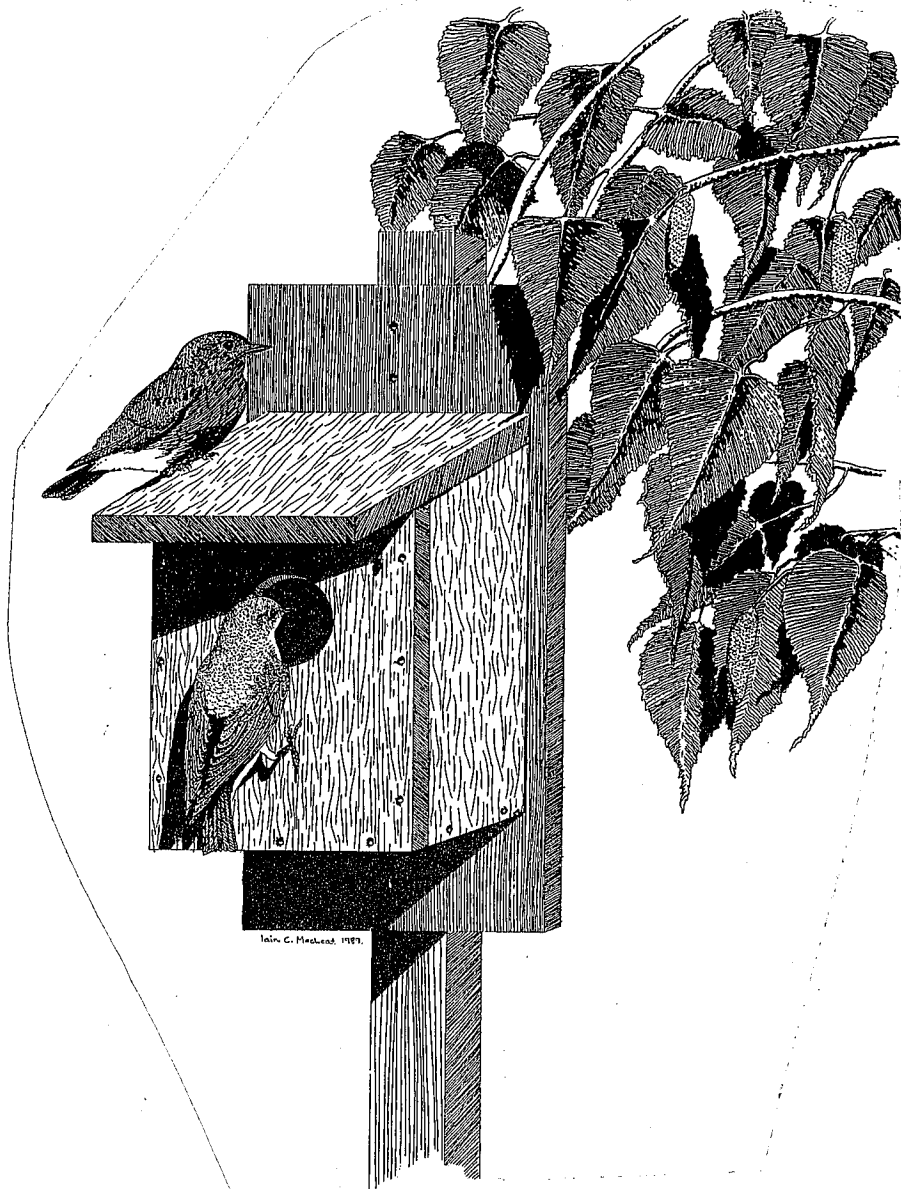

# Compiling *New Hampshire Bird Records*

We continue our quest to publish the *New Hampshire Bird Records* on a timely schedule of four issues per year. Despite the lack of visible results, we have made great strides behind the scenes. Data entry for all seasons is up to date, we are preparing the first two 1990 seasons for publication, and all other seasons are with their seasonal editors. We appreciate your continued patience and support.

If you are not familiar with the *New Hampshire Bird Records*, a brief outline of the procedure follows. All bird sighting slips are received at Audubon House and entered into the computer. The computer printout then goes to the seasonal editor, who interprets the information and writes it up. It is then returned to ASNH where it is readied for final publication. Timely submission (monthly) of bird report slips greatly facilitates this process. A detailed explanation of the reporting procedures can be sent to any interested birder. If you have not reported and would like to receive this information, please contact Becky or Diane at ASNH.

We are excited to report that the number of sightings submitted continues to climb, with over 2000 received for spring of 1990. In response, we have had to implement a more rigorous editing format to keep down the cost of each issue. This means that not every record received will be in the published manuscript. However, each record will be computerized and archived in the files. All records are still of great historical value and it is still extremely important to maintain statewide coverage.

In the 1989 seasons you will find that entire species groups have been deleted. The phenomenon of missing groups results from a need to save space in the final publication, and reflects those species where reports were of little significance. A list of the missing groups and the names of all reporters can be found at the end of each season. Anyone who would like a copy of the full computer printout for a season may obtain one for a small fee. Please contact us directly if you are interested in this service.

We would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to all the many volunteers who helped make this publication possible. We could not do it without them. A special thank you goes to Ruth Lang, Tom McMillan, Marie Neveu, Jill Simmons, and the four seasonal editors. Front and back cover illustrations are by Iain C. MacLeod. Thank you also to those who have made special monetary contributions to *Bird Records*. These go into a restricted fund which is used exclusively for *New Hampshire Bird Records*. This kind of support is extremely important and very much appreciated.

Good birding to all, and let us know what you come across.

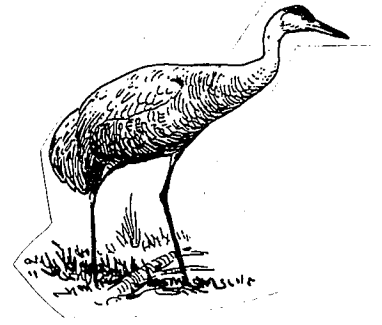

# Fall Season

August 1 through November 30, 1989

August of 1989 began with high humidity, thunderstorms, and temperatures soaring into the 80°s and mid-90°s. By the end of the month, however, some areas of the North Country saw the first frost of the season. A wave of warblers passed through northern New Hampshire on August 19.

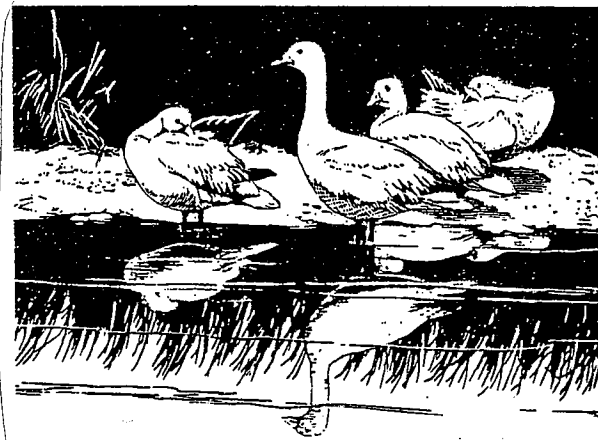
September was warmer and wetter than normal, with no strong cold fronts passing through until late in the month. The big **Broad-winged Hawk** flight pushed through inland areas of the state on September 13, and observers in coastal areas saw good numbers riding the high winds generated by Hurricane Hugo on September 23.

With over seven inches of precipitation, October was the wettest since 1981. The passage of a cold front on October 12 provided a few glorious, clear days and set the stage for some substantial movement among the state's birds, including a flock of 300 **Snow Geese** in Sutton.

Cold weather dominated New Hampshire during November, with temperatures well below normal. The middle of the month marked a transition to cold Canadian air masses, and temperatures plummeted. By November 24, several areas of the state had reported temperatures below 0°. Mt. Washington recorded an incredible five and one-half feet of snow by month's end, with lower-lying areas receiving over a foot.

Among the highlights for the season were two **Sandhill Cranes** over the Connecticut River in Hanover, a rare treat for this part of the country. Other excellent sightings included a **Golden Eagle** during the fall hawkwatch at Gap Mountain in Troy, another on Mt. Osceola in Livermore, three **Dickcissels** at a feeder in Chester, and two special sparrows—a **Lark Sparrow** and a **Clay-colored Sparrow**.

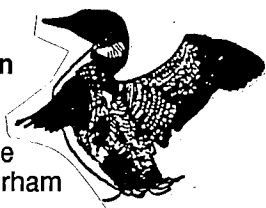

# Loons and Grebes

**Common Loons** began to show up along the coast as early as September 24, while others remained on the lakes as late as November 17. Only six **Red-throated Loons** were observed, although the lone individual on Great Bay in Durham was of interest. An early **Red-necked Grebe** was sighted in Littleton on August 14, while a scattering of inland sightings were also noteworthy for this normally coastal migrant. But most remarkable was the return of the **Western Grebe**, first sighted this fall on November 25. This individual is likely to be the same bird that has appeared off the coast at Rye for several winters.

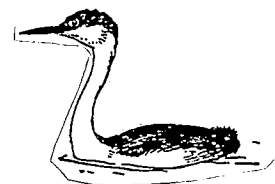

## Gannets through Herons

With no pelagic trips reported this fall, there were no reports of shearwaters, storm-petrels, or alcids. However, **Northern Gannets** were observed along the coast, with a high of three from Odiorne Point on October 21. Higher numbers of **Great Cormorants** may reflect a growth in the species' southern populations; 10 individuals were reported from six inland locations, including three reports in September.

**Great Egrets** made a good showing, with 15 individuals in the Hampton Falls salt marshes and two inland reports from Franklin and Canterbury. The largest reported group of **Snowy Egrets** was of 50 birds in Rye on August 12. **Little Blue Herons** also had a good fall with several coastal sightings, and two unusual inland reports from Nashua and Dunbarton for which details were not supplied. One **Cattle Egret** was reported in Hebron on August 31, again without accompanying details. Perhaps the most significant find of the fall was a pair of **Sandhill Cranes** that were well seen as they flew over the Connecticut River in Hanover on October 7.

## Waterfowl

Impressive numbers of migrating **Snow Geese** moved through the state, with counts of 300 on October 14 in Sutton and 225 on the same day from Mt. Cardigan. The latter group was viewed from above and included one "Blue" goose! **Canada Geese** were also well reported, with 330 migrants moving by Concord Point in Rye on October 6.

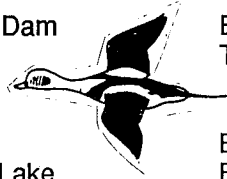
Other more unusual sightings include two reports of **Northern Shovelers** and one sighting of a **Gadwall**. No Brant were reported from the state this fall.

An inland observation of eight **Oldsquaw** in Littleton on November 4 is noteworthy, and Scoters also made a good showing on inland waters. The most impressive totals were from the Lake Sunapee area on October 18, where large numbers of all three Scoter species were seen.

## Hawks

As noted in this issue's Introduction, September was characterized by a lack of strong high-pressure systems, with very few days of strong northwesterlies. This kept the majority of the **Broad-winged Hawk** flights inland, and most of the birds passed through the central part of New Hampshire and into Massachusetts. The "big days" occurred on September 12 and 13, but very few people got out to see them. Rick Vandepoll was fortunate enough to get onto Gap Mountain in Troy on the September 13 and picked up some outstanding numbers, highlighted by 2355 Broad-winged Hawks, a **Golden Eagle**, and two **Bald Eagles**.

An excellent coastal flight on September 24 brought 408 Broad-winged Hawks, 48 **Ospreys**, 91 **Sharp-shinned Hawks**, 11 **Northern Harriers**, and 12 **Merlins** to Odiorne Point in Rye. An Osprey lingered along the Suncook River until the exceptionally late date of November 23. Ospreys generally leave the state by the first of November for their wintering grounds south of the United States.

Nine **Bald Eagles** were reported on August 27 from Lake Umbagog. This included the pair that nested as well as the foster chick that became the first Bald Eagle to fledge in the state of New Hampshire in 40 years. A well described, but not officially verified, Golden Eagle was observed on Mt. Osceola in Livermore on October 10.

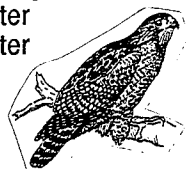

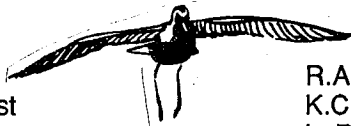

## **Grouse through Terns**

**Ruffed Grouse** are common but elusive birds in the state, and the numbers seen by George Gavutis in October were noteworthy. Equally hard to find are the rails, and 18 **Soras** in Derry was an incredible count of this rarely seen species on the rather late date of October 10. Described as fairly tame, the **Northern Bobwhites** were probably captive-bred birds that were released in the area.

Shorebird migration is always most evident at coastal sites such as the mudflats exposed at low tide in Seabrook Harbor, where large numbers of several species can sometimes be found. This fall was a good season for shorebirds, highlighted by a banded **Piping Plover** seen in Seabrook Harbor, a **Hudsonian Godwit** seen during a "hawkwatch" in Rye, three **Baird's Sandpipers** from two locations, a **Stilt Sandpiper** sighted on the late date of October 29, a **Wilson's Phalarope**, and a **Whimbrel** spotted in the unusual location of Lake Umbagog. An incredible count of 60 **Upland Sandpipers** seen on August 3 confirms the importance of the grassy habitat found near the flight lines at Pease Air Force Base. This is the only known nesting and staging area for this species in the state.

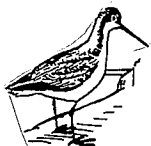

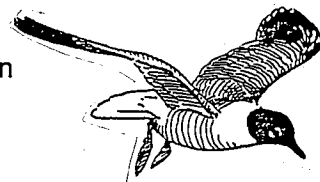

## Owls through Wrens

**Snowy Owls** moved into New Hampshire early, with two sightings coming from inland locations on October 20 and 29. Few were seen later in the season, however. **Common Nighthawks** typically come through in large numbers over a relatively short period of time in the last two weeks in August. This year the highest counts were 75 in Newcastle on August 22 and 32 in Concord on the August 28.

Four thousand **Tree Swallows** were staging along the coast in Rye on September 4, but two days later all had disappeared as they continued their southward movement. A calling **Willow Flycatcher** in Jefferson on August 19 was notable for both its northern location and late date. This species is expanding its range in the northeast.

**Carolina Wrens** are seen sporadically in the southern part of the state at almost any time of the year. The five individuals reported this fall were notable, especially since they were reported from Concord, Pittsfield, and even as far north as Plymouth.

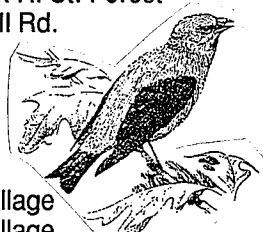
## Tanagers through Snow Buntings

At least a couple of **Indigo Buntings** lingered in New Hampshire this season, with one seen October 6 in Durham and a very late bird seen on November 3 in Plymouth. **Dickcissels**, fairly rare in the state, were represented by three individuals that joined a flock of **House Sparrows** for two days in Chester.

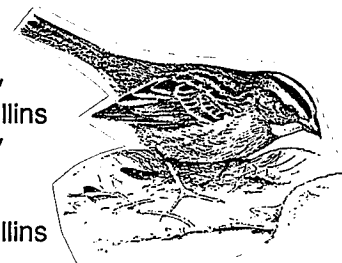
Relatively low numbers of **Tree Sparrows** were reported this fall, with the first sighting on October 8. The most notable sparrow sightings of the fall were an immature **Clay-colored Sparrow** seen feeding with a flock of **Chipping Sparrows** in Stratham and an adult **Lark Sparrow** spotted in Greenland. These western species are rarely seen in the state, but when they are, they're often associated with Chipping Sparrows. **White-crowned Sparrows** had an excellent year, with numerous reports during the middle part of October.

**Dark-eyed Juncos** arrived in large numbers during mid-October, with a high report of 250 birds in Jefferson on October 19.

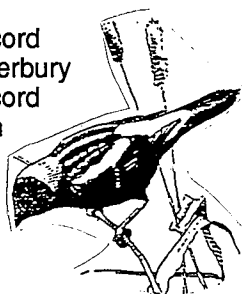
## Bobolink through Evening Grosbeak

A very late **Bobolink** was reported from Milan on October 25. A flock of 100 **Rusty Blackbirds** in Canterbury and 200 **Brown-headed Cowbirds** in Seabrook were both notable totals. A lingering **Northern Oriole** was seen at a feeder in Concord on November 18.

**White-winged Crossbills** were abundant this fall, with numerous reports from the beginning of August through the end of October. An impressive flock of 40 birds, the largest reported, was spotted in Canterbury.

According to reports, **Pine Siskins** were common, but there were very few reports of **American Goldfinch**. One report of four immatures being fed on August 29 is interesting even for this late-nesting species.
