

## Compiling New Hampshire Bird Records

We continue our quest to publish the New Hampshire Bird Records on a timely schedule of four issues per year. Despite the lack of visible results, we have made great strides behind the scenes. Data entry for all seasons is up to date, we are preparing the first two 1990 seasons for publication, and all other seasons are with their seasonal editors. We appreciate

your continued patience and support.

If you are not familiar with the New Hampshire Bird Records, a brief outline of the procedure follows. All bird sighting slips are received at Audubon House and entered into the computer. The computer printout then goes to the seasonal editor, who interprets the information and writes it up. It is then returned to ASNH where it is readied for final publication. Timely submission (monthly) of bird report slips greatly facilitates this process. A detailed explanation of the reporting procedures can be sent to any interested birder. If you have not reported and would like to receive this information, please contact Becky or Diane at ASNH.

We are excited to report that the number of sightings submitted continues to climb, with over 2000 received for spring of 1990. In response, we have had to implement a more rigorous editing format to keep down the cost of each issue. This means that not every record received will be in the published manuscript. However, each record will be computerized and archived in the files. All records are still of great historical value and it is still extremely important to maintain statewide coverage.

In the 1989 seasons you will find that entire species groups have been deleted. The phenomenon of missing groups results from a need to save space in the final publication, and reflects those species where reports were of little significance. A list of the missing groups and the names of all reporters can be found at the end of each season. Anyone who would like a copy of the full computer printout for a season may obtain one for a small fee. Please

contact us directly if you are interested in this service.

We would like to extend our heartfelt gratitude to all the many volunteers who helped make this publication possible. We could not do it without them. A special thank you goes to Ruth Lang, Tom McMillan, Marie Neveu, Jill Simmons, and the four seasonal editors. Front and back cover illustrations are by Iain C. MacLeod. Thank you also to those who have made special monetary contributions to Bird Records. These go into a restricted fund which is used exclusively for New Hampshire Bird Records. This kind of support is extremely important and very much appreciated.



## Winter Season

### December 1, 1989 through February 28, 1990





Temperature extremes—first bitterly cold, then unusually warm—characterized the winter of 1989-90. Not surprisingly, these atypical conditions affected bird reports throughout the season. Many December regulars were scarce or unreported, while many early migrants arrived on accelerated schedules.

December 1989 was by far the coldest ever experienced in northern New England. Average temperature for the region was just 6.1 degrees—a severe 14.5 degrees below normal. For New Hampshire, it was also the sixth driest December on record, even though North Country snowfall was near or above normal.

After a sunny start to the month, a winter storm with brisk northwest winds brought snow to New Hampshire on December 3. More snow on December 6 was followed by one day of nearly seasonal temperatures—then the mercury took a nose dive. Except for a brief respite on December 10 and 11, the state remained in the grip of record-breaking cold throughout the month. Temperatures during the three days before Christmas averaged 15 to 22 degrees below normal.

In a dramatic reversal, the month of January featured near-record warmth. Temperatures during the month rarely dropped below zero, making this New England's fifth-warmest January on record. Precipitation, too, was above normal.

After a cool New Year's Day, milder temperatures and conditions arrived on January 2. The coldest days of the month occurred on January 14 and 15, and then conditions became quite balmy, with temperatures above 50 degrees and record highs on January 18 (57 degrees in Concord). The second half of the month was unsettled, with a mix of heavy rains and light snowfalls.

The above-average temperatures continued into February, which closed as the tenth-warmest on record for southern New England. Precipitation was near average. The first week saw freezing rain, sleet, and snow. Milder temperatures ruled for the next week: average temperatures on February 9 were 15 to 25 degrees above normal. The first migrant Belted Kingfishers, Northern Harriers, Ospreys, Turkey Vultures, Eastern Bluebirds, Red-winged Blackbirds, and Peregrine Falcons arrived during this period.

A cold front on February 13 brought snow and ice, and, on February 19, colder air and brisk winds. The cold lasted only until February 22, when a large area of unsettled weather spread moisture into our region. Strong southwest winds pushed ahead of the storm, carrying in some of the warmest temperatures of the month as well as a **Ring-necked Duck**, several **Canvasbacks**, and a **Common Grackle**. High temperatures broke records on February 23 and 24 before the month ended on a cold, snowy note.

Across the season, high numbers of Peregrine Falcons (9), Black-capped Chickadees, Tufted Titmice, Red-breasted and White-breasted Nuthatches, Bohemian and Cedar Waxwings, Snow Buntings, and Rusty Blackbirds were reported. Species notably low this season were Red-throated Loons, Great Blue Herons, Golden-crowned Kinglets, Purple Finches, and House Finches.

Highlights for the season included a Western Grebe near Odiorne Point (third year), a Yellow-bellied Sapsucker on the Hanover-Norwich Christmas Bird Count (first on CBC since 1977), and the sightings of a Sharp-tailed Sparrow (first report since 1981) and two Grasshopper Sparrows on the Coastal CBC (fourth record in 30 years).

### **Loons and Grebes**

Red-throated Loons went unreported this winter. They were missed for the second consecutive year by the Coastal CBC, perhaps because of the extremely rough seas that day. Common Loon numbers were below average for the entire season as well.

For the third consecutive year, a Western Grebe wintered with Red-necked Grebes in the Odiorne Point/Rye Beach area; it was sighted first in November and then periodically through February 12. Although Horned and Red-necked Grebes wintered in average numbers, rough seas resulted in low tallies for these species on the Coastal CBC.

### **Gannets through Herons**

The Coastal CBC tallied three Northern Gannets. Only four Great Blue Herons—just one-fifth of the average over the last five years—were reported for December from all sources; presumably the month's extreme cold and lack of open water accounted for this. For the first time since 1979, no great blues were reported by the Lee-Durham CBC.

An immature Great Cormorant in Meredith on December 3 was unusual, while as many as 88 were seen off Seabrook on one December day. After that sighting, however, their numbers dropped off significantly. No Double-crested Cormorants were reported.

### Waterfowl

Despite the season's early freeze-up, the Christmas Bird Counts reported 19 species of waterfowl. Highlights were two **Wood Ducks** (only the second CBC record for Concord), two **Green-winged Teal**, a **Northern Pintail** (off Cedar Point, new for Lee-Durham CBC), and an adult male **Ring-necked Duck** (second CBC record for Hanover-Norwich).

Surf and White-winged Scoters were present in average numbers during this coldest December ever in northern New England, but all other wintering species of waterfowl were below average (Canada Goose, American Black Duck, Mallard, Black Scoter, and Greater Scaup) or notably low (Common Eider, Oldsquaw, Common Goldeneye, Bufflehead, and Hooded, Common, and Red-breasted Mergansers). For the first time since 1981, Barrow's Goldeneyes were missed on all the CBCs and went totally unreported.

### Hawks

Three early migrant **Turkey Vultures** were sighted at the end of the winter season, the first in Walpole on February 11.

Bald Eagles were especially well-covered this season. In addition to the sightings by ASNH eagle project volunteers, over 225 reports (four times the 1988-89 total) were received—far too many to list individually. This interest and dedication served to identify at least 66 different individuals (43 adults and 23 immatures). The major wintering areas (with numbers of individual eagles) were the Connecticut River (13), the Merrimack River (15), the Androscoggin River and North Country (9), Great Bay (8), and the Lakes Region (8).

Three Northern Harriers (new for Keene CBC), at least 28 Sharp-shinned Hawks, four Cooper's Hawks (new for Lee-Durham CBC), and six Northern Goshawks were reported.

Other raptor reports include 75 Red-tailed Hawks, 11 Rough-legged Hawks, one Osprey (early February!), nine American Kestrels, and nine Peregrine Falcons (six of which returned to northern ledges by mid-February).

## **Pheasant through Shorebirds**

It was a good season for **Wild Turkey** sightings—flocks of 30 and 46 were reported from Dunbarton and Walpole, and record numbers were tallied by the Keene and Upper Contoocook Valley CBCs.

Except for 18 Purple Sandpipers on the rocks off Hampton, all other shorebird reports came from the Coastal CBC. These include 55 Sanderling, 76 Purple Sandpipers, 65 Dunlin, and one Common Snipe.

## **Gulls through Alcids**

Common Black-headed Gulls, which had become fairly regular winter visitors to the Portsmouth/Rye area, were missed entirely for the first time since 1982.

Five Iceland Gulls wintered on the coast, and four were seen inland. At least four Glaucous Gulls wintered near Portsmouth Harbor, while seven others were observed at sites from Lee-Durham to Berlin.

The Coastal CBC recorded the only **Black-legged Kittiwake** and **Black Guillemot** sightings.

## **Doves through Woodpeckers**

Three hours of owling yielded five **Great Horned Owls** for the Lee-Durham CBC. The only **Snowy** Owl reported this season was a brown-speckled immature seen February 15 carrying a mouse near the interstate in Concord. Other owl reports included nine **Barred Owls**, nine **Saw-whet Owls**, and a single **Short-eared Owl** (first since 1985).

The Hanover-Norwich CBC had a record high of five **Belted Kingfishers**, and, despite the frigid temperatures and frozen waters, several others were seen during December as well.

An immature Red-headed Woodpecker in Hillsborough was adequately described, although additional details were not submitted. For the sixth consecutive winter, a Red-bellied Woodpecker was in the Granite State. This well-described female frequented a Bow suet feeder through mid-winter. A female Yellow-bellied Sapsucker, seen in Etna, represents a new species for the Hanover-Norwich CBC, but the report included no further details. The only other CBC sighting in the past 30 years was on the Upper Contoocook Valley CBC-CW (count week) in 1977. Also on the woodpecker front, ASNH received an unprecedented number of Pileated Woodpecker and Northern Flicker sightings this winter.

## **Larks through Wrens**

Horned Larks were reported in high numbers this year, especially by the Nashua CBC, which had its highest total in 25 years.

The Lee-Durham CBC tallied a new species with a single **Gray Jay** that was being mobbed by Blue Jays near Colony Road in Durham. **American Crows** were reported in average numbers, and a flock of 350 individuals feeding in a Dover field was noteworthy.

The Keene CBC and all CBCs north of Concord approached or broke record highs for **Black-capped Chickadees** and both **Red-breasted** and **White-breasted Nuthatches**. Increased backyard feeder use during December's extreme cold may have contributed to the high number of sightings.

Each year we see more Carolina Wrens during the winter months, with three last year and six this year. A Winter Wren represented a new species for the Upper Contoocook Valley CBC, while the Coastal CBC reported the season's only Marsh Wrens.

## Kinglets through Shrike

Reports of Golden-crowned Kinglets were fewer in number this year, while a Ruby-crowned Kinglet was a new species for the Keene CBC.

Of the 12 Eastern Bluebirds that lingered late in Walpole, at least five overwintered there. The earliest reported migrant bluebirds returned to Hopkinton on February 12.

Reports indicate that remarkable numbers of American Robins, Bohemian Waxwings, and Cedar Waxwings were in the state this season (far too many waxwings were reported to list individually—only large flocks are listed). Undoubtedly one of the major reasons for the tremendous influx of these species were the outstanding berry and crab apple crops available to them. Nearly 100 American Robins were seen, with the northernmost sighting being the two reported by the Hanover-Norwich CBC. While flocks of Bohemian Waxwings averaged around 50, flocks of 200, 155, and 145 were seen in Plymouth, Northwood, and Sanbornton, respectively. Cedar Waxwing flock size averaged 25, yet as many as 500 were seen at one time feasting on tea crab apple trees in Dover. All Cedar Waxwing sightings occurred south of Pittsfield.

Two Varied Thrushes were confirmed this year, and two Brown Thrashers were discovered on CBCs (Coastal's first in eight years, Nashua's second in 25 years).

## **Warblers through Snow Buntings**

The Orange-crowned Warbler seen on the Coastal CBC (their third in 15 years) was studied at close range as it foraged in an apple orchard off Great Bay Road in Greenland. The Coastal CBC also recorded seven Yellow-rumped Warblers, which was about average for them.

The Hanover-Norwich and Coastal CBCs both had their highest totals for Northern Cardinals in 15 years, while the Nashua CBC had its highest in 25 years.

Noteworthy sparrow reports include three Rufous-sided Towhees, four Field Sparrows, four Savannah Sparrows, nine Fox Sparrows, one Sharp-tailed Sparrow (first winter sighting since 1981), and two Grasshopper Sparrows (only the fourth record in 30 years for the Coastal CBC).

Snow Bunting reports were too plentiful to list in their entirety; only large flocks are listed. The average flock size was approximately 40 birds.

## **Blackbirds through House Sparrow**

Blackbirds lingering into December included six Red-winged Blackbirds, eight Rusty Blackbirds, five Common Grackles, and 45 Brown-headed Cowbirds. The first migrant Red-winged Blackbirds were seen February 12, and a Common Grackle was sighted on February 24.

Among the finches observed in low numbers this year were Pine Grosbeaks (small flocks of fewer than 16 birds), Purple Finches (only 110 reported), and House Finches (Keene CBC reported only one-fourth the number of last year, Coastal CBC just one-half, and Lee-Durham and Hanover-Norwich CBCs each tallied only one-third of the previous year's total). Common Redpolls remained up north; White-winged Crossbills were plentiful, especially during February (average flock size 20); and American Goldfinches and Evening Grosbeaks were reported in average numbers.




