Fall Season

August 1 through November 30, 1990

Warm and very wet weather characterized August 1990, but that didn't impede fall migrations of many species. For instance, peak numbers of shorebirds (1,200 Semipalmated Sandpipers and 700 Semipalmated Plovers) were reported from the coast on August 18 — also the date for the month's highlight of a **Marbled Godwit** in Seabrook. A storm on August 24 and 25 brought over four inches of rain to Concord, and under clearing skies on August 26, Bob Quinn reported significant totals of 14 different warbler species, including ten Chestnut-sided, eight Cape May, and five Black-and-white, all in his Canterbury backyard!

A storm from the Great Lakes that passed through on September 25 was the apparent cause for a remarkably early and heavy Broad-winged Hawk flight observed by a September 9 Bristol hawkwatch, which tallied 1,865 Broad-wings. Another front passing through the area on September 15 provided good hawkwatching at several locations on the following day. Notable sightings for the month include a **Clay-colored Sparrow** well away from the coast in Enfield on September 30 and — September's highlight — a **Northern Wheatear** feeding along a driveway in Bristol for four days.

An unusually warm October was also the wettest on record across New England. The month brought four of the most interesting sightings for the season: a **Western Kingbird**, two **Greater White-fronted Geese**, five well-described **Brewer's Blackbirds**, and a late, inland **Red-necked Phalarope**. By the end of the month, what later turned out to be a sizable Northern Shrike invasion had begun, with the first reports coming from two locations on October 28.

The first significant snow fell in northern parts of the state on November 10, but birds lingering in other regions included a Semipalmated Sandpiper along the coast on November 16 and an Osprey on November 24. The Northern Shrike invasion continued, and a possible Loggerhead Shrike was also reported. By November 24, the Western Grebe that has become a regular winter resident of the state had returned.

Loons and Grebes

Fifty Red-throated Loons seen along the coast on November 3 were the only ones reported. An October 9 survey of Common Loons on Lake Umbagog yielded an excellent total of 72 adult and immature birds. Pied-billed Grebes were well-reported, with at least 33 individuals and a high total of five in Amherst. Reports of Red-necked Grebes came from three inland locations while only one report (12 birds) came from the coast. For the fourth consecutive winter, a Western Grebe returned to the waters off Pulpit Rocks in Rye.

Unfortunately, no pelagic trips this fall meant no reports of shearwaters, storm-petrels, or alcids. Observant birders on whale watches and fishing trips can help us cover these species more thoroughly by reporting sightings of off-shore birds. Great Cormorant reports appear to be coming in earlier over the last few years, and more reports are coming from inland locations; this year a remarkably early and errant individual was seen in Errol on August 31! Three other inland reports during the month of September are noteworthy, but curiously, Great Cormorants were not well-reported from the coast. Migrating Double-crested Cormorants peaked around October 10, when 3,000 were observed at the coast.

Six inland reports of Great Egrets is a significant number for this southern coastal heron, and one was as far north as Monroe. A young Yellow-crowned Night-Heron in Rye on September 16 was a nice find, and two Glossy Ibises seen flying north in Hanover on August 21 was rather unusual.

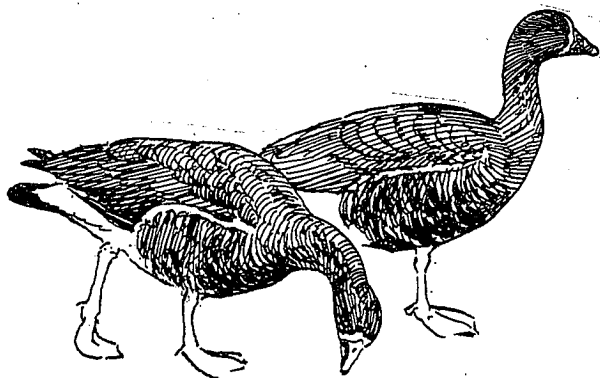

Waterfowl

Certainly one of the best sightings of the fall, two **Greater White-fronted Geese** (one adult and one immature) were seen on two mid-October occasions in the same Hollis field, feeding with about 200 Canada Geese. Several observers along the coast reported three Brant on the incredibly early date of August 18, a full month before they should start arriving. In Errol on October 9, an impressive 160 Blue-winged Teal were seen, and a female Northern Shoveler was reported at Eel Pond on the late date of November 11. Sea ducks were poorly reported, with the only noteworthy sighting being three early White-winged Scoters on August 18 in Rye. Inland, White-winged Scoters were moving on October 10, 11, and 12, when 144 birds were seen at five different locations.

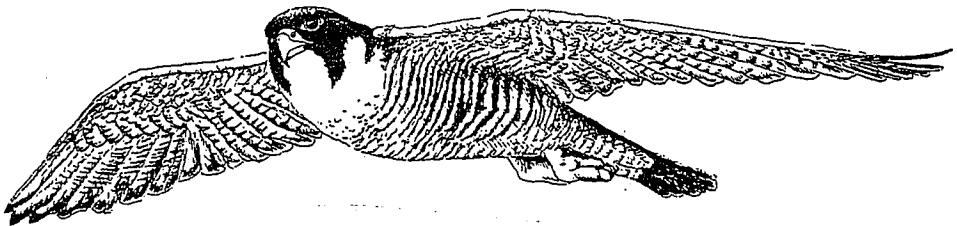
Hawks

Small numbers of Ospreys were seen through October, but the only noteworthy sighting of a very late bird was from Sullivan on November 24. Bald Eagles were well-reported from all around the state, with a total of 17 individuals for the season. A very early flight of migrating Broad-winged Hawks passed by Little Round Top in Bristol on September 9, when 1,865 were counted in just over seven hours; on September 13, another great flight yielded a count of 1,124. The Bristol hawkwatch also reported two Golden Eagles within one week. Only six Merlins were reported for the fall, but Peregrines were seen everywhere: At least 23 birds were reported for the season, with the best total (6 birds) reported from the summit of Mt. Chocorua on September 28.

Turkey through Terns

Several excellent shorebird sightings this season came from inland as well as coastal sites. **Marbled Godwit**, **Buff-breasted Sandpipers**, **Baird's Sandpiper**, and **Lesser Golden-Plovers** highlight the list, but probably the most unusual sighting was a **Red-necked Phalarope** found well away from the ocean at Mascoma Lake dam in Lebanon on the very late date of October 13. Late dates were recorded for several other species as well, including a **Spotted Sandpiper** in Lebanon on October 20, a **Red Knot** on November 24 in Seabrook, a **Semipalmated Sandpiper** in Rye on November 16, a **White-rumped Sandpiper** in Seabrook on November 24, and a **Pectoral Sandpiper** in Canaan on November 4.

At least three **Common Black-headed Gulls** were reported this fall (with an early individual seen on September 8), and a late **Laughing Gull** was reported on September 23. Because **Roseate Terns** are rarely seen along the New Hampshire coast, the report of one at Seabrook Harbor on August 18 is notable. Also from Seabrook Harbor came an October 14 report that included two **Common Terns** and one **Forster's Tern**.

Doves through Wrens

Only one Great-Horned Owl was reported for the entire season, but Barred Owls were well-reported from several locations. Two Short-eared Owls were notable finds, especially the one at Manchester Airport on November 14. The season's only Snowy Owl report came from Hampton Beach State Park on November 19 — surprisingly, this was the season's only Snowy Owl report for all of New England.

Although Common Nighthawks were well-reported, no large migrations were noted. Two or more individuals seen in Canterbury on September 30 were somewhat late for this species. Two very late Ruby-throated Hummingbirds were reported on October 18 in Lyman. Birders should take careful notes on any Hummingbirds seen after mid-October in hopes of documenting a Rufous Hummingbird, a species that has been recorded in New England in the last few years.

Woodpecker highlights include two young Red-headed, in Concord on October 9 and Jackson on November 7, and one adult male Red-bellied in Bristol on November 13. An Eastern Phoebe lingered in Walpole until November 1, but the season's flycatcher highlight was the well-reported Western Kingbird in Seabrook on October 9.

The only noteworthy sightings of swallows include 3,000 staging Tree Swallows in Seabrook August 28 and a migrating flock of 40 Bank, 22 Cliff, and 128 Barn Swallows moving through Haverhill and down the Connecticut River on August 18.

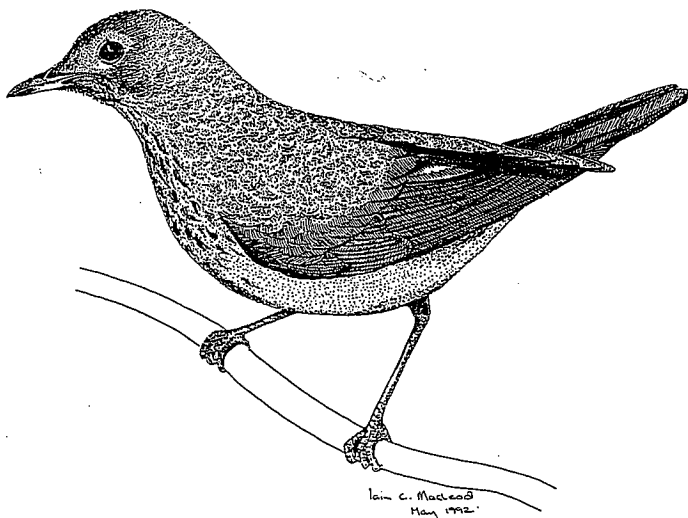

Kinglets through Starlings

The Northern Wheatear first reported from Bristol on September 7 is certainly one of the most exciting sightings of the season. The bird fed along the same driveway for four days. Increasing regional reports of this bird in recent years may indicate changes in its migration pattern. With 184 individuals seen, Eastern Bluebirds were well-reported, continuing the encouraging pattern of increased numbers for this species.

Listening for migrating birds at night is fun and challenging. Thrushes give distinct call notes which, with practice, you can identify. Bob Bradley was able to hear the distinct call notes of the Veery as he counted 18 migrating overhead on the night of September 12.

Over 20 Northern Shrikes, with at least six adults and 10 immatures, were reported starting in October, and a well-described, but not officially verified, Loggerhead Shrike was reported from Henniker on November 16, a rare sighting of this declining species.

Tanagers through Grosbeak

While Chipping Sparrow numbers peaked at the beginning of the October, Tree Sparrows arrived promptly during the last few days of October, with several reports received. White-throated Sparrows had a good fall, with a high total of 77 on October 9 in Gilsum, but White-Crowns, with only 15 total birds reported, had a relatively poor season compared to last fall. The Clay-colored Sparrow seen in Enfield on September 30 was the season's most notable sparrow sighting.

From the coast on November 3 came the significant report of 300 Snow Buntings, as well as 12 Lapland Longspurs. Pine Siskin totals were way down from last year's, and White-winged Crossbills, which were widely reported last year, were not reported at all this season.

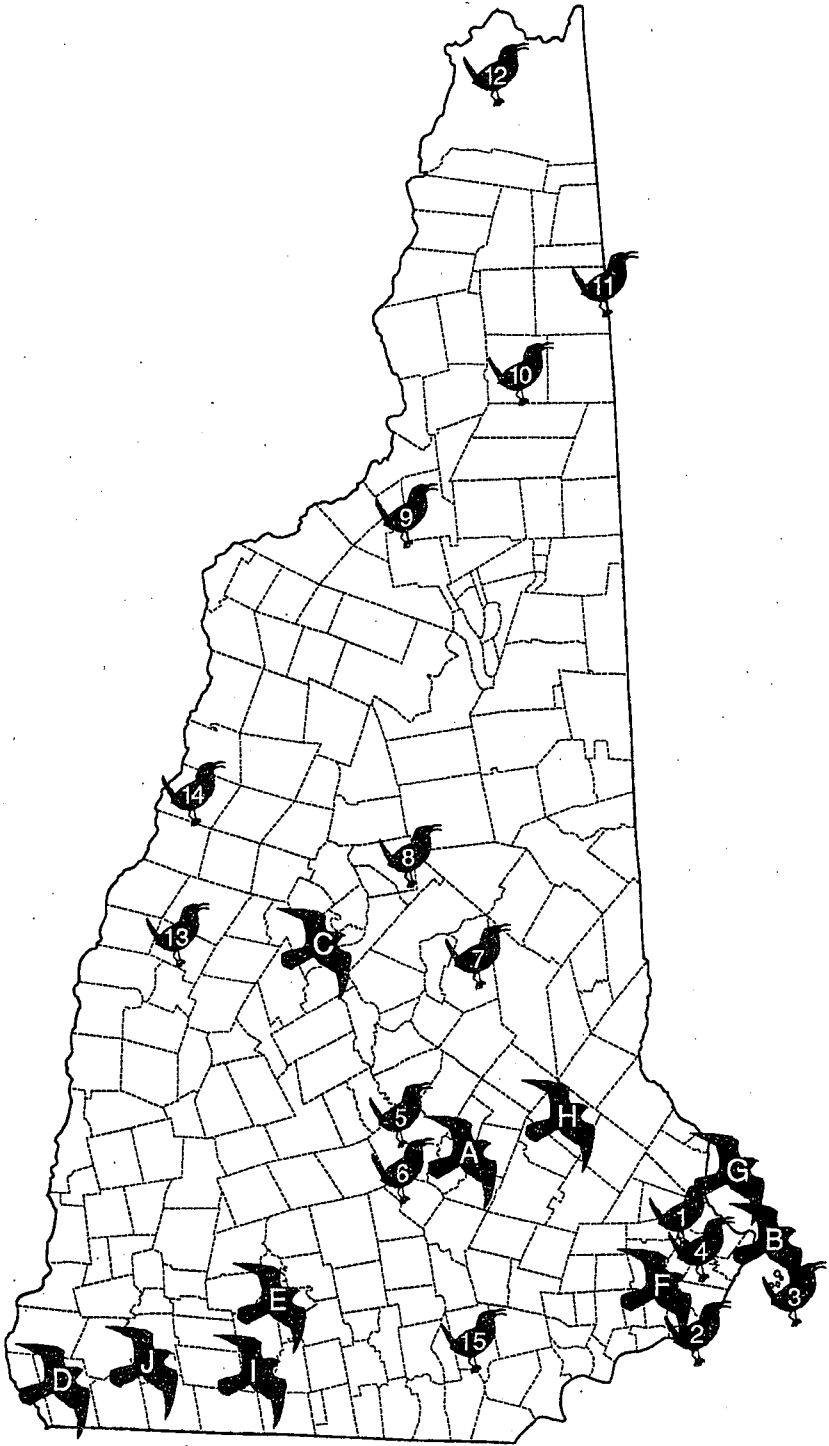

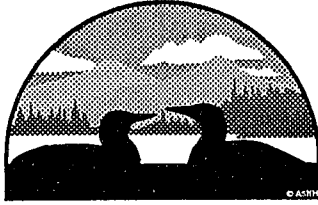

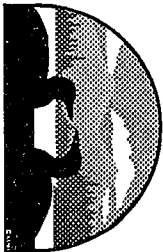
